It was a great morning on the 5th March when Amelia MaGoff was dedicated in our second service. Amelia is a regular attendant to junior church which runs every Sunday. With proud parents John and Mitchell along with family members, friends and church family joining the celebrations on this special day.

What is dedication? A Dedication Service is a ceremony in which parents thank God for the birth of a child and make promises about how as parents they will look after their child. It's called a 'dedication' because in the Bible a woman called Hannah was unable to have a child for a long time and when she did eventually have a baby boy her response was to dedicate him to God.

In the dedication service parents are asked to make the following commitments...

I acknowledge that my child is a gift from God.

I will be a conduit for God's love to my child.

I will communicate to my child that he/she matters to God.

I will pray for my child.

I will commit to do all I can to raise my child in a home that honours God, and support his/her spiritual growth.

Child Dedication is a commitment service where parents promise to raise their child in a God honouring way.

**Examples from Scripture:** Luke 2:22-25 where we see that as a baby, Jesus' parents dedicated Him to God's work; and Mark 10:16 we see Jesus bestowing blessings on the children.

#### Church family

The church family will also make promises to support the child and their parents as they seek to bring the child up in the knowledge of God.

#### Godparents

Sometimes people nominate a friend or another member of the family as a 'godparent' who will support them in bringing up the child and who is invited to promise to be available as a friend to the child as they grow up and to set a good example. Other family members or friends who are present are also invited to express their support.

During our Monday evening prayer sessions I requested prayers for Ghana's elections. God heard our prayers and provided us with a new government !

The Government is doing amazing things for the people.



For the first time Secondary School Education will be free, beginning from September this year. In one district, one factory initiative has been launched and budget allocation given to drive the programme. This initiative will be led by the private sector. Ghana is now an oil producing country since 2011. The revenue from the oil proceeds will finance the enumerated government programmes.

I have also started a pre-school education centre for children from 1 - 4 years. The centre currently has 20 children and I expect to expand with time. The aim is to support my Community to develop its educational base. I pray this initiative will be a blessing to every child who comes through it's doors.




# Thanks Gladys

#### Christian Aid Week: standing with refugees like Nejebar



Nejebar and her family have fled horrors in Afghanistan, where her husband was threatened with torture and death for being a government worker.

But now they've arrived in Greece, all they have is a tent. They have no other protection against wind and rain. There's no school for their five children. And they have no certainty or clear idea of what will happen to them now. They thought they would stay here for 10 days, but it's already been six months and there's no end in sight.

Nejebar's husband Noor describes their initial reaction to arriving in the camp in Greece: 'It was like suicide for us. But we took the decision that it is better to die here than to die there from war.'

## You've helped us be there for refugees since 1945

Thanks to you, Christian Aid has been there for refugees like Nejebar since 1945, providing essential food, shelter and legal assistance for people far from home. And we still believe in life before death.



Coffee bar open from 11am, lunch served at 12.45.


