

What an excellent evening it was on Sunday the 10th of June when we welcomed the Baptist President of Great Britain, the Revd David Gregory to Aylestone Baptist Church.

David recalled his time here in Leicester when he was a young student, a scientist at the University of Leicester studying physics and astrophysics.

It was while David was in Leicester studying that he found his reconnection with his Christian faith after being challenged one day by a student colleague who

asked him, "Are you a Christian?" (David was an atheist when he started university) this stopped David in his tracks and has he began to think about the wonder of God, the greatness of God.

David's message on the evening was from the book of Job, where God answered Job about the greatness of God.

In his newly renewed Christian faith David searched for a church to attend and it was



at this time David, together with his girlfriend (who became his wife), Caroline, came to Aylestone Baptist Church in the early part of the 1980's and worshipped with us on a regular basis when the Rev Brian Thomas was the minister here at ABC.

David spoke about starting small for God. The importance of one to one in our conversation with people, for it's God who blesses the small things that bring Him glory and bigger things follow.

Who would have foreseen this young man studying in Leicester as a physicist struggling with his faith would one day become a church leader, minister and the leader of the Baptist Union. Praise God.



The puzzle is based on Luke 11:1-9 (NIV).





