What a wonderful day! Fabulous weather, lots of happy people having a great time!

On Sunday 1st July members from Aylestone Baptist, St Andrew's and St Edward's Churches held a fourth family fun day 'Aylestone 2018' in Aylestone Hall Gardens

After an open- air morning service in the Park, the activities began.

Shortly after they started Emma from Radio Leicester arrived as part of their 'Clueless' event – looking for a clue! She found it on the Rodeo Bull and went off to Anstey for the next clue.





Attractions included Bouncy Castle, bouncy slide, football shoot-out, rodeo bull, face painting, and during the day various activities – football relay, Children's games, Have a go bowls, Petanque [Boules].





There was food [subsidised so all could afford!] and ice creams and many folk had brought a picnic to enjoy eating in the park, as the weather was so good.

At the 'stage' area a brass band played two sessions, there was a dance display and Zumba to join in.





The Churches had an information stall and two of our local youngsters who are going on overseas community projects next year had a stall to help raise funds for their trips.

We estimate that over 1000 people came through the park during the day. The day was free thanks to a very generous grant from the Leicester City Council Aylestone Ward Community Fund. People were invited to make a donation to charity, and we were able to give donations to Rainbows Children's Hospice, a South African football charity which works with very deprived youngsters, and small donations to the two youngsters towards their trips.

We had very many expressions of gratitude from the local people who attended – and a request to repeat it again in 2020!.

So how did I come to be here today? As you all know I've been brought up in the church from a very young age and sort of knew no different. Music has always been the way that god touched me and my first real experience that I can remember was at spring harvest when I was about 11. We were in the young people's seminar and all of a sudden whilst a song was being played by the band I felt very weak and broke down and started crying and I was immediately surrounded by group leaders who started to pray for me. Then through my teenage years to early adult hood I really lost touch with my faith and was never really that interested for a

few years. Certain things started to come into my life which really steered me away from my faith and I felt like I didn't know the way back. 12 months ago I left to start a life in America and experienced a new side to Christianity. Through an organisation put in place by the university directed at Christian student athletes and the influence of my girlfriend Rylee, I realised that God is there and that He is so much bigger than I am. I felt that God was calling me to go and restart my journey through Him. He started to redirect my life and I almost felt like wherever I went I had a presence by my side. Then one night alone in the dorm I felt a presence with me and like before I broke down into tears but as I lay on my back in bed I felt like someone was hugging me and it reassured me that all that's happened in my life is in the past and that all the pressure and weight I had on my shoulders would be lifted. Then I realised that by being baptised I had an opportunity to make things right with God and to start afresh with His guidance. I always knew that He was there to protect and guide me but I sort of ran away and pushed Him aside. Philippians 4:14 says "I can do all things through Christ, who strengthens me". So here I am today, ready for a new start.

How do we pray?

The last few months have seen many disasters around the world, collapse of a bridge, volcanos erupting, earthquakes, wildfires, continuing conflicts in Syria and Yemen, unrest in many countries, and sometimes we feel so overwhelmed we don't know where to start with our prayers. Here is some advice taken from the book "Dirty Glory" by Pete Grieg (a book well worth reading):

- 1. People Afflicted: We ask God to comfort those who suddenly find their lives torn apart by grief, loss, fear and trauma.
- 2. Pastors and Priests: We ask God to give courage to church leaders, seeking to bring Christ's presence and hope in the midst of trauma and profound questions of pain.
- 3. Peacemakers, politicians and police: We ask God to give clarity and wisdom to government agencies and NGOs, blessing and supporting their efforts to bring justice, reconciliation and aid.

Pray the 3 Ps in a disaster:

- 1) People afflicted: Comfort
- 2) Pastors: Courage.
- 3) Peacemakers: clarity.

Σ igma Garden Party

It is nine years since Dorothy and Stanley set up the Σ igma charity with Rev'ds Yesupadam and Sanjeeva from Calvary Baptist Church in Akividu, India. In that time over £60 000 has been raised for the amazing ministry in that town and its surrounding area. Dorothy and Stan have made two mission trips there, and a number of the family, all involved in the ministry have visited us here at Aylestone. The money we raise goes towards supporting the Christian ministry and outreach programmes, many Children's programmes, relief programmes particularly in the annual monsoon months when floods occur each year. This year's floods, as you may has seen, have been very bad in India.

Some of the money raised over the years has paid for the building of a shelter in a small settlement of 'untouchables' who are unbelievably poor – living in grass huts with no water, no electricity, no sanitation – nothing!

The Calvary Baptist Church meets in the upstairs 'prayer hall' of the building where some of the family live. The only two toilets are in the living quarters – so imagine what happens when, at major events – when often over 3000 people come to outdoor services in land next to the Church. So one of the aims for our fundraising is to build some toilets.

We raise funds in a number of ways – we have some regular givers, others give what and when they can. We sell cakes & jam at Open House, run Quiz nights, fun days and an annual Garden Party – which this year took place on Sat. 25th

August. We raised about £600 on the day, including generous donations. We are registered with HMRC for the recovery of gift aid and this increases our income substantially.
