"The Paris doctor warned us that the baby would never reach full term, and without an abortion, he warned, my own life would be in danger.



Our ears took in the words; our minds refused them. Destroy the child we'd waited for? Thus, after three years of roaming Europe as travel writers, John and I hurried home to the specialist my anxious family had located in New York City.

Only to confront a second crisis. Two major New York newspapers had recently folded, scores of expert writers were out of work. The jobs we applied for had waiting periods before we could even get on a list.

Doctors' bills were mounting and the one resource we had, our writing experience, was worth nothing. The one resource, that is, that we knew about... We had no idea back then in 1950 about the all-sufficiency of God.

Our anxiety had reached the desperation point when John found a stop-gap job. Just until something better turned up, he was to be a reporter for a little sixteen-page religious pamphlet published out of a couple of hotel rooms. He thought the name was Guideposts.

"Religious?" I asked incredulously, "Did you tell them we don't go to church or anything?" He had, but the editor, a man named Len LeSourd, had simply smiled. "God has a plan for you John, no matter how hard you try to run from it."

The baby was born, full term and healthy – our son John Scott, now thirty-nine, a country music writer, a husband and father himself.

And John and I were launched on a lifetime of Christian writing – and the biggest travel adventure of all: the journey of faith.

"God has a plan for you....." It's true of every human being. Sometimes when you're deaf as John and I were, it takes seeming disaster to point it out."
