Letter from the editor

Dear friends,

I worked for many years as a peripatetic woodwind teacher, giving music lessons in various schools across the city and county, plus private lessons at home. The lessons are on a one-to-one basis and inevitably the relationship becomes part music teacher, part confidant. I have supported a number of men through their "midlife crisis", when they wanted to play the saxophone (the alternative when they can't afford a sports car); I had long conversations with a "lifer" in Leicester jail; but most of my time was with school children with their ups and downs.

I've never forgotten that incident, the faith of that child. Did she ever master D minor scale? Did her faith grow? I'm not likely to ever meet her again so it's in the Lord's hand.

My dear friend, Beryl Thomas, recently sent me a copy of the ABC 100 years celebration leaflet (she was clearing out Brian's study), and in the forward by the minister of the time, 1971, Rev. A. Leslie Hilliard, writing of the changes our country had seen over the last 100 years, including 2 World Wars, he writes:

"....and yet this Christian cause, started by a mere handful of very ordinary people, not unlike the very start of Christianity itself, has remained, not as some small museum piece, some monument in a graveyard to brave folks' hopes, but still alive and active."

Bless you Mr. Hilliard. And here we are, still alive and active another 48 years on. As we look towards Easter, there are deep theological truths to be studied, and many sermons and thoughts, but when we strip it back, this group of very ordinary people that is Aylestone Baptist Church, we will find the real meaning of Easter, as that little girl said: Jesus Loves Us.

Prayer Room


The newly refurbished prayer room at the back of the large hall, is now finished.

Good Friday Walk Of Witness on April 19th at 10am


A journey around Aylestone Churches remembering the story of Good Friday.

Our sympathies to Elaine Pantling on the passing away of a very dear aunt.





Spotlight on Church Family Night.



It was after much thought and prayer that our Youth Minister brought forward the proposal to close the Friday Night Open Youth Club and instead make this an evening for Church families to grow, bond together, have fun - and this has now been running for a couple of months.

A good mixture of ages have come along, ranging from 4 to 84 (roughly!), and from 6.30 to 8pm it makes a relaxing and worthwhile end to the week.

Already some have had proper conversations with church family they had only managed a "good morning" to on Sundays. Some have seen a different side to folks - who would have dreamed the church treasurer would be so competitive at "Dobble" (what is it – come along and see).

The evening ends with a prayer to send them on their way.

If you haven't given Family Night a try, come along on your own or with your own family – all are part of our Church Family and this is a wonderful way for us to draw ever closer to each other.



The race.....

Derek Redmond, twentysix years old, was favoured to win the four-hundred meter race in the 1992 Barcelona Olympics. Halfway into his semi-final heat, a fiery pain seared through his right leg. He crumpled to the track with a torn hamstring.



As the medical attendants were approaching, Redmond fought to his feet. "It was animal instinct" he would later say. He set out hopping, pushing away the coaches in a crazed attempt to finish the race.

When he reached the stretch, a big man pushed through the crowd. He was wearing a t-shirt that read, "Have you hugged your child today?" and a hat that challenged, "Just do it." The man was Jim Redmond, Derek's father.

"You don't have to do this," he told his weeping son.

"Yes I do," Derek declared.

"Well then," said Jim, "we're going to finish this together."

And they did. Jim wrapped Derek's arm around his shoulder and helped him hobble to the finish line. Fighting off security men, the son's head sometimes buried in the father's shoulder, they stayed in Derek's lane to the end.

The crowd clapped, then stood, then cheered, and then wept as the father and the son finished the race.

What made the father do it? What made the father leave the stand to meet his son on the track? Was it the strength of his child? No, it was the pain of his child. His son was hurt and fighting to complete the race. So the father came to help him finish.

God does the same. Our prayers may be awkward. Our attempts may be feeble. But since the power of prayer is in the One who hears it and not the one who says it, our prayers do make a difference.

Ann's busy few weeks....

Ann Buxton is a "bitch holder" for Guide Dogs for the Blind, with 5 year old Labrador, Tess.


Tess lives as part of the family, and has a lovely life with Ann and Wal, and during her life will be expected to have 4 or 5 litters.

Recently Tess gave birth to her 2nd brood – 10 in all, 5 black and 5 yellow, and Ann was "midwife" for the 7 hours it took for the little ones to be born. They are named as the "E" litter, each one named with that letter, i.e. Elton, Emily etc.. and marked in the order they were born.

During the 6 weeks that Ann is caring for the pups she will be supported by a daily visit from a Guide Dog supervisor.

When the puppies leave Ann and Tess they will go to the National Breeding Centre at Lemington Spa to be profiled, then after 5 days they are sent out to puppy walkers for a year, then to advance training, and finally matched to a blind/visually impaired person if suitable, whilst some may go to work in medical detection.

The puppies are sponsored by individuals or companies, at a cost of £2,500 per puppy, but the difference these cute little bundles of fur will one day make to a blind person is priceless.
