The series will ask what it means to be a faithful Christian in the 21st century. I love the words of Dr. Katharine Schori in the foreword:

"The daily prayer of our hearts reminds us that we are created of stardust to bring celestial possibility into earthly reality 'Your kingdom come...on earth as it is in heaven." She goes on: "read, dream and sing - and discover the spirit at work around you in unexpected people, places and invitations...away from our comfort zones and self-constructed prisons...it will likely exceed your expectations and limited vision. It is indeed a crazy dream, but together, the Body of Christ can most certainly help to build the kingdom, transform brokenness, and renew the face of the Earth".

What I'd like us as a church to do, is start a Crazy Christians WhatsApp group, to discuss and give feedback on each week's message, to encourage each other to act out what we think the Lord is saying to us through His Word, to discover afresh what it means to discover His Spirit at work around us in unexpected ways, people and places, and to build His kingdom, transform brokenness and renew the face of the earth.

I personally can't think of a better way to start a new year, and hope you will join me!

The Spirit of Aylestone Churches Together **Advent service** was held at our Church. The service featured our choir (ably trained by Beth), and it was lovely to share with folk from the other churches in Aylestone, to sit after the service with a cup of tea and mince pie, and just have fellowship together.



The **Gateway Nativity Service** marked the start of the Christmas Services. This year we featured the story of Scrooge and his journey from darkness to a new life. Then the Nativity was acted out as our choir sang and Mary, Joseph and baby Jesus, angels and shepherds formed a lovely tableau.

The Gateway Club for adults with learning difficulties meets each Wednesday at our Church, and all enjoy the monthly worship services led by Stan. These are always joyful services, and it was lovely to share with family and friends some of this joy and exuberance at Christmas time.

We began our **Lunch Club** Christmas Dinner with a Carol Service, led by Stan and featuring children from Granby School who sang a number of songs and delighted the Lunch Club folks. Over 70 then sat down to a hearty, traditional Christmas Lunch. Thanks to all who worked so hard to prepare for and clear up after this event.

I'm sure it hasn't escaped your memory that October, November and the beginning of December were some of the wettest on record, and so there was some trepidation as we planned **Carols in the Park** at Aylestone Hall Gardens. On Sunday  $15^{th}$  December I believe we witnessed Divine Intervention. The day was perfect, the rain that was forecast didn't arrive until much later. The ground wasn't a quagmire as the Park authorities had feared. Families came in their hundreds (estimated 350-400), to listen to the brass band, sing carols, and enjoy the children's nativity. We handed out brightly coloured finger torches, hot drinks and mince pies. What a joy it was to hear the air around Aylestone Hall Gardens filled with the sound of singing of our Saviour's birth.





The following Tuesday was again a beautiful evening when about 250 squashed into the marquee in the garden at the **Black Horse Pub** to sing carols and listen to readings. There were many lovely comments and thanks to the churches for putting on this event. We certainly blessed our community of Aylestone with these events.



**Carols by Candlelight** evoked a thoughtful mood with contemplations between the singing of carols and items by our choir. Thanks to Stan for leading this beautiful service as Christmas Day came ever nearer.



Christmas Eve **Carols for Kids** saw the church full of children, parents, grannies and grandads, all excited as Christmas Eve should be.

Our Sunday School children were fantastic bringing out the Christmas story to



two aliens who had just landed on our planet. Who can forget the "Kiss moose" misinterpretation, the grumpy housewife, the dads watching the queen's speech (resting their eyes!). At last the real meaning of Christmas came together as the younger children formed the Nativity tableau. Before the last carol multi-coloured finger

torches were handed out and the lights turned down, as we sang "O What a Night". Thanks to Beth Ellis and the Sunday School for all their hard work.



11.30 on Christmas Eve saw in Christmas Day with Communion, and for those who wished, lighting a candle within the manger in remembrance of those who would not be spending Christmas with them this year.

### 1. Be a peacemaker.

It is so easy to get worked up about things; people who wrong us, family drama, church drama, etc. But resolve to be the one who brings peace. Don't spread the rumours, don't listen to the stories, don't join the clique. Be the one who initiates peace and unity.

### 2. Only do things that are pleasing to God.

Jesus made the statement that he only does those things that please the Father. He is our Older Brother and our perfect example – so we too, should only do the things that please our Father. We are not saved and justified just so we can do whatever we like – our salvation comes at a great price! Therefore, Paul tells us, you are not your own.

### 3. Always do the work of the Lord.

This old broken world makes it seem pointless to do good works. But it is not pointless. We need to keep on working, keep standing steady on God's Word. Nothing done for Christ is lost.

### 4. Triumph in Christ.

This is only possible by the power of God's Spirit within you. To triumph over depression, bad moods, grumpy attitudes, jealousy, selfishness – this is a bigger miracle than healing from sickness! Ask God to fill you with His Spirit, and walk in obedience and humility, and you will begin to triumph in Christ!

### 5. Die to self every day.

This is the secret to victory over sin. To die to self; all MY desires, MY will, MY plans – and offer myself as a sacrifice to God, daily. Dying to my need to be right, dying to my need to be respected, dying to my need for comfort... dying to ME daily. This is what 'taking up my cross' means. It's not some woo-woo theory – it is painful, daily, death to self and all my flesh desires. Wanting to get back at someone who has hurt me, wanting to profit at someone else's expense, thinking only of my own interests – these selfish desires and habits need to die, so I can be transformed to the image of Jesus Christ.

### 6. Walk by faith.

Faith that God's Word is true. Faith that He will fulfil His Word. Faith that God will take care of me, also faith that He will punish sinners — like He said. Faith that He will guide me every day. Faith that if I live a life fully given to God, and walk by the power of the Spirit — everything I do will be rewarded by God. Maybe not in this life — maybe not physically — but rewards of an eternal nature.

### 7. Always be rejoicing in the Lord.

Life is often hard. Painful. Unexpected trials. But when we have the assurance of God's love, we can rejoice in the midst of our trials, because we know that God uses everything in our lives to draw us closer to Him, and form us into the image of Christ. If we have this faith in our hearts, we can be like the apostles who sang hymns at midnight when they were in jail.

### 8. Give thanks for everything.

Again – we don't feel like giving thanks in every circumstance! But here we can go back to giving our bodies as a living sacrifice; giving thanks whether we feel thankful or not! It doesn't say: "give thanks if you feel thankful", no, we need to give thanks – full stop. End of story. It is a command, and this is where we need to obey in faith. If you start giving thanks regularly, I bet you will start to have more peace in tough circumstances. It just works that way!

### 9. Let Christ be exalted in my body.

We like to sing about giving it all for Jesus', but when it comes to our body and what we do with it – there we take a step backwards. We want to do things we want to do. We have freedom, right? But here's the thing – when Jesus Christ redeemed us from the curse of death, he paid an immense price! So we should not take that lightly. Our eating habits, manner of dress, how we care for our bodies – these things all need to be surrendered to Jesus and His Lordship. I want my body to glorify Him this year.

### 10. Be humble.

Humility is such a tricky thing, isn't it? The thing I like to remind myself of, is that other people's opinion is worthless to me. Only what God thinks of me, matters! Whether others think we are good, or whether they think we are bad – throw it into the bin! I only consider whether God is pleased with me.
