
Lord's Prayer

I chose this image because it was the nearest I could get for the meanings of the colours of the rainbow as it was God who first made a rainbow. As a promise between himself and all living creatures to never destroy all that he had made ever again. - Next to this is a picture of the stained-glass window in St. Michael's Church in Linlithgow. The colours are beautiful. Can you just imagine how this window will reflect the colours when the sun shines through it? The colours are all equal; not one any more special than another. They are all required to make this amazing artwork. There are so many different shapes and sizes of glass, all put into the different parts of the window to complete the picture the artist wanted to portray. I want you to think about what colour you would like to be and place yourself as part of a stained glass window. We are all different, but we are all special to God. When we all come together, we help to make up a very special window. Within this window we are showing just how important it is to be joined together as one walking with God. The Bible tells us that "...even as we have many members in one body, and all the members don't have the same function" (12:4) "so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually, members one of another" (12:4). Each of us has gifts. We might be able to teach or lead. or have the gift of caring and be cheery and be able to give encouragement. When our own gifts, that we have been given by God, are combined with everyone who we share the love of God with, then we will have the ability to make something full of colour to praise God. God's light transforms us, just like sunlight streams through our stained-glass windows and helps us to see the beauty of all the colours not just in the rainbow, but all around us. Could Paul see us as the congregation who knows who we are? Would he see the Holy Spirit shining in us and throughout the church? I do think that he would see us as a living church of our Lord Jesus Christ and thank us for all our different gifts that we use through our faith to the community in around us. We can thank Him and praise God for all his good gifts to us.

Let's pray: Loving God we come together to say thank you for all the gifts you shower upon us and give you all the praise and honour in your name now and forever. Amen

Intercession Prayers - Almighty, Creator God – We come humbly before your throne of grace to make known those issues and concerns which burden our hearts and those of your people this world over. Give courage and faith to all who hold the name of Jesus central to their lives. We pray for those in our health services as they get to grips with the pandemic. Support those working in laboratories to produce vaccines, giving advice on the help-lines or on the front line in surgeries and hospitals. At times of great national anxiety help us to know that all our concerns are already known to you and that from you we may draw strength to do your will in the service of others. And so, we think now of those in need in our own community: the elderly, the housebound and those in care homes, hospital and hospice. e pray for the lonely, the marginalised and those who face a future with little hope or love. We also pray for all who tend to their needs. So let us share a moment of silence together as we bring before you those known only to ourselves as we name them in our hearts and commit them to your loving care. We also pray for those who face the pain of grief at the loss of a loved one. Help us to support all those who mourn, both with our prayers and with practical help both this day and in the days and weeks to come. Today Lord, open our eyes that we may see your image in everyone we meet; open our ears that we may hear your word in the words that other speak and open our mouths that we may speak your gracious word of love to those whose paths we cross; "Accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen".

Romans 12:1-8 ¹Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God-this is your true and proper worship. ²Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is-his good, pleasing and perfect will. ³For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. ⁴For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, ⁵so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. ⁶We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; ⁷if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; ⁸if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully. Amen

Sermon: Put your left foot in, your left foot out, your left foot in, and shake it all about. You do the hokey kokey and turn yourself around, that's what it's all about. O hokey kokey.

You all know the words. The song goes through all your limbs and your head, then it asks you to put your whole self in. How many times have we all done this at parties etc., but have you ever thought that it could be biblical? In the New Testament reading from Romans today, Paul tells us to do exactly that. "Therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, I urge you to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God; this is your spiritual worship" (Rom. 12:1). "To present your bodies" is Paul's way of saying, "Put your whole self in."

We all know that too by giving our offerings each week is our way of saying, "Thank you" to God for the blessings He bestows on us. We see the baskets going round the church and envelopes and money put into the baskets. We also know that there are bank direct debits going into the church account. It is a commitment given as a form of worship, an outreach to God in grateful thanks for the gifts given to us.

The forgiveness for our wrong doings over the past week, the burdens we have worried over made lighter, but we still have to give ourselves in total commitment to God. He does not accept anything less, so we must turn towards Him and give Him the honour and praise. It is not an easy task. There are many outside distractions which turn us every other way, but we must turn from the outside worldly distractions and focus totally on God. If only we could stand up in the basket and say, "I give you my all." That would be true worship. If you could see and feel the presence of God how could you not put your whole self in? We should never forget that through Jesus dying on the cross and taking

all our sins away. we are saved by God's grace and His mercy. He gave His son to die for us. That is some gift and, with that in mind, we should give ourselves fully to Him.

How would we be feeling today if we let ourselves be turned away to the world as it and not have the gifts of forgiveness and love from God? Personally, I would be feeling very uncomfortable. I know that I need God in my life. Paul said "... to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God" (Rom. 12:1). meaning we must give our whole self. The term "living sacrifice" was the way in the Old Testament in the giving of an animal to be sacrificed. Today or by way of the New Testament, we give of ourselves - body and soul to God in thanks for what Jesus did for us through God. Life is for living. Yes, and our worship is a living thing. It is not just for Sunday morning. It should be practised every day and everywhere. Our offering to help and pray for others is worship, but not to be seen to make us look better than anyone else. We are all parts of one body working together to give God the glory and praise he deserves Paul writes, "Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may discern what is the good, pleasing, and perfect will of God" (Rom. 12:2) When we do this, we are mirror imaging how we should live. As Christians we live in the everyday world with all its distractions, but we turn away from the bad ways. We are not turned by the ways of the world. We turn, instead, to the one who loves and gave us life. We live with Christ in our hearts and he gives us the gifts of truth and an inner wellbeing, which we can as we go about our daily lives pass to others an inner calm in hectic lives. As children of God we are like the kids' transformer toys. We can turn into what God wants us to be - a reflection of Himself. God moulds us daily to live our lives for Him and through the Holy Spirit is given to us the power of the living God which will aid us to be given the way to lead a Christ-like life. We have the free will to do what we like, but we must remember that total commitment is the only way that is pleasing to God. You must put your whole self in and do the whole of the hokey kokey to offer up yourself to God
