Change, all change!

Dear friends

Alleluia! Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed, Alleluia! I hope that by the time you read this you will have already enjoyed a great Easter time of blessings. The penitentiary time of Lent is now concluded= the stories of Holy week have been recounted and the darkness and the pain of the suffering of our Lord Jesus Christ on behalf of his people has been replaced by the hope and joy of the resurrection in Christ Jesus which is ours to enjoy if we turn to Christ and say we are sorry for the things we have done wrong and for ignoring God in our lives. The disciples were fearful of the changes that they knew would come when they saw Jesus lying dead in the tomb where He was laid, and they were fearful for their own safety to the extent that they spent much time together in a locked room, but they could have had little notion of the changes His resurrection would have on themselves and millions of others who followed behind them down the ages.

Last Sunday the four Lay Ministers were invited by the Diocese of Peterborough to witness the service of installation of the 39th Bishop of Peterborough, the Right Reverend Debbie Sellin. There is little doubt that the service was a wonderful blend of tradition and contemporary liturgy and an equally impressive juxtaposition of traditional organ music as well as Stormsy (a modern Rapper) songs wonderfully sung by a young people choir. The odesigners of the serviceö had managed to put together not only a wide and varied service but they also used a broad array of people, old / young, sacred/secular/civil personnel. Bishop Debbie spoke for about fifteen minutes in which she told us a little about her life as a Priest, but she focussed on the Hope, borne out of the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour and the Hope of the Gospels. She indicated that her early months as our Bishop will be used to get to know all parts of this large Diocese whilst spreading the Good News to all those she comes into contact with. She was most inspiring and emphasised that meeting people and building relationships is of paramount importance in those who embark upon evangelism

ô put simply the telling of the Jesus story, His life, death and resurrection. We can look forward with Hope to Diocesan life under Bishop Sellin. As well as having an excellent example of how to blend the õancientö and the õmodernö so we can all worship the same God in joy in the same service. Not long after you receive this magazine we hope we will be in a position to inform our seven communities whom God has called to be the next Priest of the Naseby Group. It is appropriately a long and complicated process to allow time for the 14 representatives of the seven parishes (2 from each) not only to agree what qualities of Priest we think will benefit our parishes and create a profile for prospective applicants, but also to give time through prayer and listening to God ,to discern His will.

So please be patient, wait a little longer and we hope to have good news shortly and hold in your mind one of my favourite quotations Remember õChange is inevitable, except from a vending machine.ö So go with the flow, but remember God is the same today as yesterday our great unchanging friend. Hereøs to endurance and consistency, and may God shower us and our communities with blessingsô including a Priest to lead, and walk with us.
