## Dear friends,

Lent is now well underway and plans are being made to mark Holy week and Easter in the Naseby Group of churches.

As a group of churches Holy Week is something we will be journeying together with through joint services. These are Benefice services so please do travel and join us, as we remember Jesus's final time on earth.

On Mon 14th April, Journey to the Cross, Taize Service @ St Helen's Church, Sibbertoft, 7pm.

This will be a reflective service as we look at jesus' journey to the cross and his encounters along the way.

On Thurs 17th April, our Maundy Thursday Service, consists of a simple soup meal to mark Jesus' last supper, at Welford Youth and Community Centre, 5pm. This is a service suitable for all ages and will reflect something of Jesus final meal with his disciples. We will remember that Jesus washed his disciples feet as well as marking the meal which inspires our weekly Holy Communion services.

On Fri 18th April, Good Friday for All, Join us a we dress the cross (Alpine style) and retell the Easter Story, 4pm at All Saints Church, Clipston. In the Swiss Alpine region, this is an annual tradition on Good Friday as they remember all that Jesus did on the cross. This again is suitable for all ages. This will be followed by a fish and chips supper in the village hall. (veggie, vegan and GF options available). There will also be space after the service to wait and reflect at the foot of the cross in quiet, whilst others head over to the hall for fish and chips (both of these parts are optional).

## The Easter Message

Dear Friends.

As we prepare to celebrate Easter, let us reflect on the events. No-one lining the road into Jerusalem on the first Palm Sunday could have doubted Jesus claim to be a king, or that his triumphal entry could be anything other than a sacred occasion. He came mounted on a colt which, according to Mark (11:2) no man had ever ridden.

This fact alone points to the sacredness of the event. Kings rode on an ass when they came in peace, and only in war did they come on horseback. He refused the role of warrior, and sought for a throne in the hearts of men. In this last symbolic drama, in which actions were meant to speak louder than words, he made a last appeal to men to accept him as Lord of their lives. He came to serve, not to be served.

To emphasise this, on the first Maundy Thursday, he took the role of servant and washed his disciples feet, before He shared the last supper with them. On what was to be the first Good Friday, those same crowds who shouted Hosanna were now shouting Crucify, Crucify. Our Lord was betrayed, denied and suffered a terrible death for you and me and all mankind. Even in his hour of pain and death, our Lord still asked God to forgive.

In Matthews Gospel (28:1-10) we read that the two Marys came to look at the grave of the crucified Jesus, but instead they found an empty tomb and an angel from whom they heard the good news that Jesus was alive, raised by God, as he had said. They are told to pass on the news to the disciples, first by the angel and then by the Lord himself. However, he does not call them disciples but the more familiar term, my brothers.

Only a few days earlier the disciples had failed and Peter had denied Jesus: but now the past is forgivenLit is dead and buried, never to be remembered again. Instead, there is new life from the grave, the living Lord calls us his brothers and sisters, and commands us what we are to do, and reveals himself to us as we obey him.

The Miracle of Easter Sunday, is because He lives, we can face tomorrow, is because all fear is gone, is because I know He holds the future, and life is worth living just because He lives. God gives us the assurance that because He loves us so much, there is a place with him in Heaven as He had promised. That is the wonder of Easter Sunday.

With every blessing in our Lords name this Easter time, from all at Welford Congregation Chapel.
