#### Dear Friends,

Recently I've been thinking a lot about breathing.

Yet breathing is not something we usually think about. It's something we tend to do automatically.

But after some research, it turns out that breathing has an ability to change both our physical and mental health for the better. Being attentive to breathing can help lower blood pressure and help decrease anxiety, to name a couple of the benefits. Intentional breathing can be truly transformative.

And at its extreme breathing can help us do seemingly superhuman things. Here I think of someone liked Wim Hoff who can take a bath for an hour and a half in ice cold water with no ill effects, just by controlling his breath. Or the Tibetan Monks who can sit in the snow for hours, melting it and creating a ring of snow around them.

One of the first messages we hear about Jesus at Christmas was from the angels appearing to the shepherds ó that Jesus would bring peace on earth, and one of the last things Jesus imparts to his followers was peace, where he breathed on them the Holy Spirit, so that his followers could continue to share the peace of God with others. This breath would go on to transform the world. As such breath and peace go hand in hand.

And so we are left with a message of peace and I'm reminded of the importance to stop and breathe, because when we do, we are able to become aware of those around us and maybe even of God himself.

Peace starts with and in us, and it is from us that it can spread. This is what Jesus told his followers to do, to seek peace with God and with each other, and so as we seek a more peaceful world, may that start in us, and go forth from us, so we pass that peace onto others.
