






Dear Friends,

Imagine a typical journey into your favourite market town, where you are meeting a friend for coffee.

You get in your car and you realise that your spouse has failed to fill it up with petrol. Now you are going to be late for your meeting.

As you approach the petrol station, someone cuts you up and you ferociously honk your horn . sharing a few choice words about their driving style.

You go to pay for your petrol, and somebody pushes in front of you.

Meanwhile, at the front of the queue somebody has forgotten their credit card and the queue grinds to a halt. You are now even later and can feel your irritation levels rising. When you finally get to the front of the queue, the cashier is rude and grumpy.

You get back in your car and drive to the car park. Thankfully there are no issues here and the ticket machine is working . for once!

Eventually You turn up to your meeting and realise that after all that, the person you are meeting isn't there. You check your phone to see if they have text you, to let you know they're running late, but they haven't - they must have forgotten!

You decide to treat yourself to a coffee and cake anyway, but the person in front of you takes the last slice of chocolate cake that you really needed to cheer yourself up with.

That was the last straw, you storm out of the coffee shop and remain grumpy for the rest of your day!

I'm sure that we can all relate in some ways to these small, little annoyances, which happen from time to time. But what can we do to change our response to these encounters?

There's a proverb in the Bible which I have been reflecting on recently:

~~G~~ood sense makes a person slow to anger, and it is their glory to overlook an offence.

In moments of calm, this is sound and good advice, but it only takes a small little offence to knock us off course and ruin our day.

So how do we overlook offence?

Firstly, it is to realise that I myself am not perfect, and sometimes don't get things right. As a Christian, I find it helpful to know that God sees all offence, including my own, and he is able to forgive me and so I need to be quick to forgive others.

Secondly, it is to realise that holding onto offence, doesn't punish the person who has upset us, but it actually acts like poison within us. By being quick to overlook the offences of others, we stop the poison of resentment cascading through us and shaping our interactions with others going forward.

Ultimately overlooking an offence is to pursue mercy over resentment. So may we today be slow to anger, yet quick to forgive.

LENTEN LUNCH 2025







The Trees for Welford project has taken three years to complete and we want to say a huge ðthankyouö to all those in the village who have contributed to its success. Through the Parish Council, we have been funded by the National Lottery Community Fund ðTogether for Our Planetö. The challenge to address was: **can a sustainable community project be established in Welford to increase our tree canopy in the context of climate change?** Our conclusion is: **YES!**

For a summary and key points of our findings, please see the Trees for Welford article in February's Bugle.

Key points include:

The vast majority of villagers who engaged with the project are in favour of planting trees for the long term benefit.

Our tree cover is already under widespread attack by ash die-back and ivy.

The role trees play in Natural Flood management is particularly significant, given how near we are to the River Avon.

Welford is very short of space for the public. We commissioned professionally designed tree planting plans for The Sportsfield and The Playing Field, and consulted the Welford public. Further action is in the hands of the decision-makers.

Documented anxiety about their future because of climate change is widespread among children and young people in the UK, and evidenced in Welford.

Climate/weather change crucially affects decisions about the best trees to plant for the long term.

Climate change/emergency/crisis is here ó the weather is unpredictable, weather events more extreme. Climate scientists have indicated that our climate is expected to be similar to that of southern Spain within 50 years.

We in Welford have to identify a way forward to balance current needs with urgently taking steps to ensure that public spaces are usable in the future.


