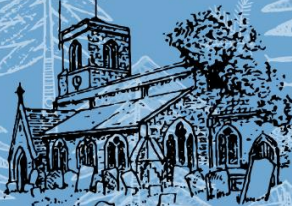

Dear Friends,

I wonder what comes into your mind when you hear the word prayer.

A recent survey carried out by the Church of England found that the younger you are, the more likely you are to pray. It found that 56% of those between the ages of 18-34 have ever prayed, with 32% saying that they had prayed in the last month.

I have recently re-watched the British comedy *Rev.* which can be found on iPlayer. Apart from the fact that it captures brilliantly some of the challenges of being an inner-city vicar in a very blunt and candid way, what I particularly like is the way in which they portray Reverend Smallbone (played by Tom Hollander) in how he prays to God. He is honest with his struggles, he often prays as he walks, asking God lots of questions, speaking to him after difficult encounters and situations.

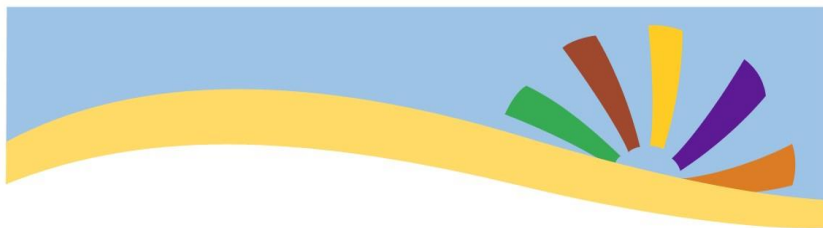
Prayer is essentially a conversation with God—it is talking to him. It is being honest with him. It is asking for his help. But like all conversations, prayer should be two ways, and we should expect to get a sense of God speaking back to us.

Prayer helps us to think of others and it invites God into those situations and concerns that we have. Prayer helps us to become more aware of God, of who he is and what he has done.

Prayer is something which Jesus said that we can all do and so every Thursday at 9:15 in term time, as a Benefice, we are going to gather at Naseby Methodist Chapel to pray together for our villages, our worshipping communities, and the wider world, as we seek to share God's love with those around us.

So this is an open invitation - everyone is welcome to join us for Naseby Group Prayers whether you consider yourself part of one of our regular congregations or not. It will be informal in style, last about 30 minutes and we will end our time together with light refreshments.
