

Dear friends,

Following a successful tidy of the garden at the rectory, with grateful thanks to those from the working party who came to help us, I can now see sheep from my office window.

Sheep are clearly an important part of country life, not just in being something more interesting to look at than a hedge, but a way of life and income for farmers and a quintessential part of the English countryside.

Sheep were also important to the people of Israel when Jesus was here on earth. Jesus was a great storyteller, who was able to connect with people often using things that were well known to them.

One of my favourite stories or parables of Jesus is of the lost sheep and it's often one I will use at Christenings because it is a story which both young and old can grasp (and we can actually act out the story with a toy sheep hidden behind a pew!)

A shepherd realised on counting his hundred sheep, that one of them was missing. He then leaves the 99 sheep to go in search of the missing one, not giving up until he finds it. Once found he takes it home and celebrates by throwing a party.

Why does this resonate with me so much? It's because at times I know I can feel lost – I can feel like that lost sheep calling out and in need of God's love – but I know that God in his great love will always find me and rescue me. As a Christian I believe that Jesus is like this shepherd, longing to seek out and find each and every one of us, to know his great love. So when we find ourselves lost and all alone, all we need to do is call out, so that we might be found by God – for he never gives up on us.
