

We Cannot Forget the Ukrainian People

It was both a privilege and humbling to be able to take part in a mission taking vehicles and medical aid to Ukraine. We were 15 in total, and each of us was tasked with raising £8000+ towards purchasing 4x4 vehicles ('past their prime but roadworthy') and vital medical equipment. In total we raised nearly £125,000 - of which

The vehicles are now all being used at or near the front in Ukraine, carrying both injured people and supplies. (Our contacts in Ukraine let us know exactly what they needed - we were then able to purchase and give direct into their hands, without any expenses or overheads. We paid for our own fuel and hotel expenses.) So once again but firstly - huge thanks to those in our benefice who donated.

We met some extraordinary people in Lviv. For example, Toma and Tatiana, who were chocolatiers and had a chocolate shop in the city. Since the 2022 invasion they decided "we had to feed our guys" and now all their ladies who signed up do is make bread. In their homes and with others - they send ten 35 Kg boxes a day, to the front. The military, they emphasise, are well fed - but there is a need for fresh supplementary such as bread.) We met Olena - who has turned her fashion factory into solely making military uniform for women. (prior to this women soldiers had to wear men's gear, which didn't properly fit.) She gives employment to about 50

women - including several who have fled from Luhansk and Donetsk.



We met an eye surgeon, to whom we gave a vital piece of equipment which crucially is portable (purchased for just over £5000) to be able to operate near the front, for soldiers who've incurred shrapnel or wounds to their eyes. He took us to the military hospital. We met both soldiers and priests - who blessed the vehicles outside the church, following a Bright Week Liturgy.



The churches in Lviv are packed often having up to four services a day. It felt a real blessing to be in an Orthodox country during Bright Week. Unforgettable was our visit to the military cemetery - I found myself overwhelmed. This soldier was approaching just as I was leaving, holding flowers in one hand whilst holding back the tears.

Bad Internet Behaviours and How To Fix Them -1 Using the same password for everything

These days we may spend quite a bit of our time online, and inevitably there is a chance that our activities become habitual - but, like regular habits, they can be both good and bad. Unlike regular habits, quitting lousy internet habits rarely ends up as a top priority list.

Checking your bank balance while using free public Wi-Fi, downloading files from 'sketchy' websites, and, of course, creating easy-to-guess passwords because "no one cares about hacking my accounts" are some bad habits you may practice. It's time to stop justifying these risky behaviours. Here's the beginning of a list of the top bad online habits and how to improve your security habits.

Reusing the same password on multiple accounts is one of the worst things you can do to your online security. It's like using the same key to lock your home, car, etc - even after someone stole the original key and could have made a copy.

With millions of records exposed in data breaches every quarter, it's easier than ever for hackers to get passwords. If you use a single password for every login, cybercriminals can use the password leaked in one data breach to access all your other online accounts. So, if you quit one bad internet habit this year, make it this one.

What to do instead: Create a unique password for every account and you can also use a password manager to store (and remember) these passwords for you.

Some web browsers will also offer to create a secure password and offer to store them for you. It's safe to do this if your laptop, PC or tablet is itself password protected – i.e. You use a biometric (face/fingerprint) log in, or have to enter a PIN or password to open your device.

Purple Emperor

In any book on British butterflies, you'll find our 58 species segregated into social ranks: the common browns, the blue-collar blues, the working-class whites. But turn the page, past the lepidopteral lowerclasses, and you will find a butterfly so unique, so magnificently majestic, so breathtakingly beautiful that for centuries British naturalists have bowed before it. Draped in resplendent robes of iridescent amethyst, obsidian, and ermine the Purple Emperor has to be one of the most impressive animals on our island. In July the purple reign begins.

Aside from an alluring appearance, Emperors also possess that combination of rarity and elusiveness which has elevated them into an almost mythological figure: a butterfly bigfoot. How a large, shiny, purple butterfly manages to exist undetected in our countryside is down to an arboreal existence. Purple Emperors spend almost all their time on lofty thrones high above our woodlands. If we're lucky we may glimpse the glide of a wide-winged silhouette as we stare sore-necked and squinting at the Sycamore skyline.

Up there, in their canopy kingdom, Emperors compete in a power struggle for territory and males gather for summer tree-top tournaments. Their wings flash as they clash in acrobatic aerial jousting, and they spar and spiral high into the Sussex skies. The Emperor's ferocity and fearlessness in the defence of his

realm are famous. Butterflies, bumblebees and other insects get a battering if they trespass and, incredibly, bemused birds (including Sparrowhawks, woodpeckers, gulls and herons) also receive a warning wing-slap.



Emperors don't lower themselves to feast on flowers like other butterfly riffraff. The Emperor sups sugars by guaffing only the finest honeydew distilled by aphids in the treetops. Yet, in complete contrast to its aristocratic high life, the Emperor has some dirty habits which drag him down to the filthy forest floor. To get his majesty's mojo working he requires a midmorning meal of minerals, which he obtains by probing his proboscis into the most disgusting muck he can find. Dog poo, used nappies, dead animals, sweaty feet - nothing is too repugnant. It's like finding the King rummaging through the bins at the back of Tesco. The female Empress does not have the shining sheen or horrid habits of the Emperor, but she too descends to lower levels searching shady Sallows for a place to lay her eggs. Camouflaged caterpillars munch from August to

June before giving rise to another distinguished (but disgusting) dynasty. Recently, the Emperor has extended his empire eastwards. Once a butterfly of north-west Sussex it can now be found all across the north of the county and has been reported around Uckfield - there have even been rumoured sightings in the very heart of Brighton - so keep your eyes to the skies.

suicide pill. Upon waking, the agent learns that the pill had been fake; 'welcome to the actual world' he is told. He visits a facility where he learns that technology has been developed that allows objects to have their entropy reversed and move backward through time, and that inverted bullets are being brought back from the future and sold on the black market.

It's a long and involved story, and film critics suggested that movie-goers see the film three times, in order to get the story, as it moves back and forth in time in a bewildering manner. It is not about life as the world knows it. It was a truly perplexing film.

The Church calendar can be a bit like that. We celebrate Christmas and three months later Jesus is crucified: we celebrate his ascension, and then we are back into studying his ministry, and his calling his disciples. We need to revisit the Word of God frequently, to make sense of it, and often, each time we read it, something else stands out. And although the narrative is the same, the context in which we live is always changing, giving us pause for thought, inviting us to do something different, or differently. It is good to have an anchor, something of permanence in our lives, holding us fast.

As I write this, the media is full of the political parties' manifestos, those promises that have been given so often, the debates, the interviews and the frankly weird behaviour of some politicians. No one is being threatened with life or limb if they don't vote as they are told to do. The army will not be out in force to keep the peace or for other sinister reasons. The chance of bloodshed at polling stations is remote. Under such circumstances, I think it is shameful not to vote, even if the decision where to place our mark is a difficult one.

We are living in perplexing times; our core values, those honourable beliefs in common humanity and care for our communities must always be where we return. On the commemoration of D-day, veterans were honoured for their contribution to making the world a safer place, so we need to do the same, in whatever small way we can. As we in church revisit familiar worship, well-known Bible readings and beautiful hymns to give us guidance and help from God 'who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine' (Ephesians 3:20); so whatever serene place or action helps you to cope in this crazy, frenetic and sometimes alien world, return there. The future may be uncertain, but life is precious, and we have much to be grateful for.

A few lines from a poem by WD Hardy seem so appropriate: 'The story of the parish, has turned another page, and most their parts are playing, upon another stage, but summer still comes softly, as in a bygone age.'
