FROM THE PARSONAGE

Recently a retired art psychotherapist who spent 30 years working with teenagers told me that in the last couple of years she had witnessed an explosion in mental health problems associated with social media platforms. On the same day I heard of a young man at the beginning of his career who had stepped out of classroom teaching because he was expected to be available to parents 24/7 via email and social media and found constant parental interventions and expectations too much on top of the demands of teaching and record keeping.

Reaping the benefits of the digital world while avoiding the pitfalls is challenging. Recognising, understanding and teaching people about this is something that needs to happen quickly. There has been such rapid digital development that many people have drifted into problems inadvertently. Acknowledgment of this is the first step to redressing issues. When the problem is digital addiction then acknowledgment can in fact be the hardest first step.

It is important that we have time and find places where we can withdraw from the world, the digital or non-digital, to rest, reflect and recover. The Christian faith finds its focus in the resurrection, the regeneration of the life of Christ from his death on the cross. Through Christ's cross humanity finds a connection with the divine source of life and is renewed. This is what people have found throughout the different periods of history, each with its own challenges. Humanity creates problems as it tries to solve them and without acknowledging our need for divine grace we're make ourselves very vulnerable.

FAMILY SUPPORT WORK: SEPTEMBER 2021 UPDATE

Dear Friends,

The new school year has just begun and we can look back on a lovely summer of activities supporting our families as well as many events where we were able to catch up with supporters. Over the school holidays our practitioners were able to organise a huge range of trips and outings for their families, including some visits to the Mothers' Union caravan in Selsey, cinema outings, beach and picnic days and trips to Drusilla's. Although we weren't able to hold our annual teddy bear's picnic at Warnham Park it was still fantastic to see families out and about, enjoying fresh air and the chance to try new things after so long spent in lockdown.

We were also delighted to welcome 50 walkers to our sponsored Amberley-Arundel Walk last month. It was a perfect day for walking and catching up with old friends. At the time of writing, just over £3000 has been raised through sponsorship and we are hoping that this total will reach £5,000 in the coming weeks. Thank you to everybody who took part or sponsored somebody else – these funds are vital to ensuring the continuation of all of our services across Sussex.

Now that things have more or less returned to normal, we are putting the final touches to the planning of a residential weekend at Dalesdown – our first for

two years – which is happening this coming weekend. It is so exciting to be able to spend quality time with families and allow them to focus on their own wellbeing and family relationships without their usual worries when they are at home.

Beowulf - An Anglo-Saxon Poem in an Anglo-Saxon Church

Saturday 30 October 2021, 6.00, starting in Arlington Village Hall and then in St Pancras Church

No-one knows exactly when, after a day of hunting or fighting, at the end of a feast, a bard first stood up in a Saxon mead-hall and entertained the warriors with the story of how Beowulf, mighty leader of a band of brave warriors, crossed the sea to the land of the Scyldings and fought the ravening monster Grendel.

No one knows, either, exactly when the first place of worship was built on the spot where St Pancras Church now stands, but it is quite likely that the first building, remains of which were discovered under the floor during Victorian restorations, was built at the same time as that unknown bard first raised his voice over the din in that unknown mead-hall.

So it's entirely appropriate that the launch of the Friends of St Pancras Arlington's huge fundraising effort to make St Pancras secure and welcoming for our community and congregation for the next thousand years should start with a performance, in English (with occasional lines in Anglo-Saxon!) of "Beowulf" by Michael Bloom.

Michael is a semi-professional actor, having started his acting career with the National Youth Theatre and appearing in over a hundred plays and operas in the UK and abroad. Locally, he has supported fundraising through his acting talents, devising and performing his one-man show "Coleridge: the Man and the Mariner" at Arlington. He also performed in Berwick Church in "Boys Ellman" and at London's Royal Institution, and Berwick, in "Bloomsbury, Bloodshed and the Bible" to help raise funds for restoration of the Berwick murals.

Michael says: I first encountered "Beowulf" and Old English as a student of English and Drama and hope you enjoy this performance, which includes all the major events of the poem, but cut to about half the length of the original 3182 lines. This translation is mostly modelled on Michael Alexander (Penguin edition), further inspired by my wife Nicola and by Julian Glover's adaptation for his own celebrated "Beowulf" performances, plus some of my own translation. It includes a few short passages in Old English to give a flavour of the amazing power of the original language of this supreme poem. This performance features replicas of several of the artefacts found in the Sutton Hoo burial mound including one of the iconic Sutton Hoo helmet.

The performance starts in the Village Hall at 6.00, where there will be a chance to take some refreshment and look at an exhibition about the poem and the finds at Sutton Hoo, and then cross to the church (a mead-hall for this occasion!) where the performance will start at 6.30. There will be a short interval at about 7.10, in the church, followed by the second half and then a hog roast (with vegetarian options – please let us know in advance) in the Village Hall car park at about 8.00. Please wrap up warmly and feel free to bring your own tankard or drinking horn!

After some recent radio silence, just to let you know that after an application by the Long Man Parish Council to Wealden, as of Friday 20th August the Giants Rest is now an 'Asset of Community Value'.

This means that (for at least 5 years) the Giants Rest has to now be sold as a pub, unless disposed of otherwise by gift.

The Giants Rest cannot now be sold for residential use.

Should the local authority be told that it is to be sold, we (the community) have 6 weeks to say that we are going to submit a bid. A further $4\sim$ months can then be used by the community to submit a bid, so we have 6 months leeway.

This gives us the opportunity to put a bid in for the pub if we want to.

I have set up a WhatsApp group, and will invite you on your number that you submitted from our June meeting, with a link.

Bringing Back Elms to the Downs

Would you like to receive free disease resistant elm trees to plant this winter?

During 2019 and 20 we have planted 120 Elms in Long Man parish, that are resistant to Dutch Elm Disease. This is a South Downs National Park project, attempting to replace some of the elm trees we have lost, and that are continuing to die from the disease. There is a research element to it too, as the various elm cultivars planted will be monitored as they grow.

The SDNP biodiversity officer Sonia Lorenzo-Martin has recently visited the parish to see how some of our young elms are doing. She was impressed with our efforts and is offering more elms to plant this winter. These are available for free to any Long Man resident/land owner, whether in or outside the SDNP boundary, provided recipients agree to nurture and protect the trees and allow future monitoring.

Drusillas Emotional Moment - 100-Year Old Betty Fulfils Lifelong Dream To Meet Serval Cat



A touching and emotional moment was made possible for 100-year-old cat lover Betty Morris this week, as she was invited to a specially arranged, one-off, close encounter with serval cat Nwela at Drusillas Park – an experience that had been a lifelong ambition.

Animal enthusiast Betty has supported the Zoo's serval cats for many years by way of adoption, and has become a fond member of the Drusillas family with her irresistible charm and undeniable passion for animals – in particular the serval cats, whom she first became aware of at Drusillas.

On 1st September 2021, Betty was invited to visit the Zoo before their public opening time and was accompanied by Keepers into the serval enclosure to enjoy a unique nose-to-nose experience. Head Keeper Gemma led Nwela through a practised routine using a training stick, food and a clicker, to bring her near to Betty's wheelchair.

After the encounter, Betty held back tears as Deputy Managing Director, Cassie Poland, presented her with a surprise honorary serval adoption and a large, personalised plaque that was hung outside the enclosure to mark the beloved relationship Betty has with the servals.



Betty spoke about the experience: "This has always been on my bucket list! It was wonderful... Nwela came right up to the side of the wheelchair, and it was such a privilege. I've had a special soft spot for servals ever since Drusillas got them... this means an awful lot to me"

Beautiful serval Nwela - who joined Drusillas from Banham Zoo in April 2021 - was hand-reared as a youngster and as a result has had lots of experience around humans. Once Nwela started to settle in and it became apparent how much she enjoyed her training, Keepers at Drusillas

conceived the idea of finally making Betty's dream of meeting servals come to fruition.

"The whole team at Drusillas are incredibly fond of Betty, it's really hard not to be!" commented Head Keeper Gemma Romanis. "We love updating her on her favourite big cats when she visits, and she's put so much time in over the years to get to know each serval we've had."

"When Nwela joined us and I was able to continue her training, it didn't take long for the idea of an encounter for Betty to come up - and everyone was on board without hesitation. How many opportunities do you get to fulfil someone's life ambition?"



Not typically an animal that can be involved in close encounters, the idea was carefully considered, planned, and tested by the Drusillas team. Keeper Gemma spent weeks preparing and training Nwela for her moment with Betty; gradually introducing her to a wheelchair in the enclosure, choreographing a routine that included a few safe moments close to Betty, with several rehearsals before the big day.

Gemma continued: "Knowing how important this would be for Betty, I wanted to make sure the experience was as successful as possible, and it also gave Nwela and I an opportunity to bond, as she was missing the relationship she had with her previous keepers. I am immensely proud of how well she did and it's an honour to be able to work with such an amazing animal."

Betty celebrated her 100th birthday at Drusillas in May and was treated to close encounters with their resident meerkats, lemurs and armadillo – and now she can cross serval encounter off her bucket list! Her granddaughter Kirsty, who accompanied Betty during the serval encounter, gifted her an annual membership and Betty visits as often as she can.





All in all, it was a fabulous day, and a big thank you to Philip who provided the plants, and to Rose and Victoria who clean the church on a weekly basis throughout the year.


