How things progress is down to what the Government have to say in the next week or so.

Sunday worship is in Church and on 'zoom' at the same time, and will follow the 'zoom' pattern we have been using throughout lockdown until the 20th June 2021, (the eve of Step 4), when hopefully we can start to get back towards our Sunday pattern of services.

The Church is open: Monday and Wednesday at 10.15 for Morning Prayer and at 10.15 on **Friday** morning for Holy Communion. The church has been newly marked out to allow groups / bubbles of up to 6 to sit together, but keeping a 1 metre plus gap between each group, or individual, so we are still masked, and we still sit socially distanced, and there is no congregational singing. We are still reliant on the "zoom" choirs mostly for our hymns, and there is too much 'sitting' for my liking, but if things go well, it is only for a few Sunday's more. Sadly, there is no tea or coffee afterwards, or opportunity to chat.

Our seated capacity for the congregation has risen to a possible 70.
