SUNDAY READINGS AND PRAYERS

The Collect

Let us pray that we may be faithful to our baptism.

Heavenly Father, at the Jordan you revealed Jesus as your Son: may we recognize him as our Lord and know ourselves to be your beloved children; through Jesus Christ our Saviour. **Amen.**

New Testament Reading: Acts 8.14-17

¹⁴Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. ¹⁵The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit ¹⁶(for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). ¹⁷Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Gospel Reading: Luke 3.15-17, 21-22

¹⁵As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, ¹⁶John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." ²¹Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, ²²and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

Post-Communion Prayer

Lord of all time and eternity, you opened the heavens and revealed yourself as Father in the baptism of Jesus your beloved Son: by the power of your Spirit complete the heavenly work of our rebirth through the waters of the new creation; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

First Communion: I'm very much aware that we haven't as a church been able to admit any of our young people to First Communion. If there is someone in your household who you think is ready, and at least 7 years old, please get in touch with Revd Tim. We will be admitting people to First Communion during our 9.30am service on Sunday 30th January, and will need to arrange two preparation sessions in advance.

Next steps in faith... The last 18 months may have raised questions about faith and God. For some, you may be thinking would like to confirm, or even explore, for yourself the promises made on your behalf at baptism. For others, you maybe interested in going back to some of the essentials of the Christian Faith and have some question to ask!

Eco Church tip: At Christmas many of us get large plastic tubs of chocolates, sweets and biscuits. Greene King are running the 'Tub2Pub' recycling scheme for these tubs, and raising money for Macmillan Cancer Support in the process. Simply take your (clean and empty) tub to a Greene King pub or restaurant, from Jan 1st-31st, for example, *The Inn on the Green.* See <u>http://www.tub2pub.co.uk/tub2pub/</u> for more details. This raises money for charity and recycles the plastic, saving it from going to landfill.

Do you have a calling for ministry to children and young

people? As a Parish we are exploring how we might more effectively minister to the many young people who live in our midst. At the moment we are completely looking afresh at what this might look like. If you, or someone you know, might be interested in shaping this part of our parish life and getting involved in helping out, please let Revd Tim know.

Want to learn more about the Bible? The Bible Reading Fellowship (BRF) publishes a range of booklets to assist us in reading the bible: from 'New Daylight' giving daily bible passages with interpretation to 'Day by Day with God' rooting women's lives in the daily readings. Some of which are digitally available. I will put out a selection of booklets in the church porch for you to borrow and experience.
