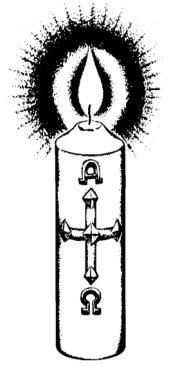
For Nancy, coming for baptism this month.
