

Aston Eyre Hall is a Grade 2\* building, commenced in 1333 but the owner died during the Black Death in 1348 and it is suggested that the main Hall was not added for possibly another 100 years. The whole site, including Aston Eyre Hall Farm, was fortified and it is believed that the Church would have been within such fortifications.

It was a lovely afternoon, and many people worked well together to create fun and games for all who came.

We start this month with the celebration of the Platinum Jubilee which is an extraordinary occasion. The Queen holds for our nation and for the Commonwealth many memories. It may be a generalisation to say that in a household it is often the mother that manages the memories – birthdays, bits of holiday, organising get togethers. Certainly it was my mother that remembered these occasions, and created them with special meals. I am delighted to be able to celebrate this historic occasion because it brings to my mind pictures from the newspapers of similar gatherings which unite the nation. ## **Morville Parish Council**

The Parish Council Annual General Meeting had to be deferred from 9<sup>th</sup> May to the 23<sup>rd</sup> due to our locum clerk having other commitments. The main business was the unanimous re-election of Steve McDermott as our Chairman. It was immediately followed by a Parish Council Meeting, at which Caroline Bullock was co-opted to the Council to represent Upton Cressett.

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on the 16<sup>th</sup> May, and included reports from Steve and Chris Maclean, our locum clerk, who explained that the Council's financial position seems better than when we submitted the precept in January. The bill from Shropshire Council for election expenses is less than we were warned that it might be. A licence agreement, between Morville PC and Morville School, has been discovered – it clarifies the situation regarding responsibility for grass cutting and maintenance of the playing field, and the school has now taken over this commitment, which had cost the previous council many thousands of pounds over the last few years. We will now have enough money for a reserve fund, as well as for current and future projects.

There are two defibrillators in Morville Parish, each installed in a redundant public phone box. We have recently provided the defibrillator in the phone box in Monkhopton with new batteries and pads. The phone box there is in a very shabby state, and Cllrs David Gibson and Lesley Moxon-Jones have agreed to take responsibility for arranging its refurbishment, and re-painting it in the correct shade of red. The defibrillator in Morville is maintained by the Village Hall Committee, but the phone box itself is the property of the Parish Council, and will also eventually need some maintenance.

The Rev'd Sarah Cawdell took the opportunity of thanking Steve and Chris for all their hard work, and what they have achieved since the start of this year.

**PC Andy Boardman** from our Local Policing Neighbourhood Team [SNT] was present, and we discussed local crime and what the SNT, the Council and the local community can do to fight it - theft from farms and outbuildings, and traffic offences, particularly speeding down the Corvedale. It was agreed that the SNT would start attending PC meetings when such issues are on the agenda.

The meeting then became more informal and at the end we served tea, coffee and some delicious cakes which had been provided by the President of the WI, Katie Briggs-Thomas.

### Hello Everyone,

As I write this we are preparing to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Whatever your view about having a hereditary monarch from a historical point of view most of us alive today will not see such a long serving monarch again in our lifetime. Queen Elizabeth the Second came to the throne 70 years ago she has already reigned longer than Queen Victoria who reigned for 63 years and 7 months and King George III who reigned for 59 years and 96 days. This is a significant historical event and it should be marked with appropriate national celebration. Some of you reading this may have met the Queen and have very clear memories of that moment and the impact it made. The jubilee coincides with Pentecost and the 'Thy Kingdom Come' global wave of prayer organised by the church and it strikes me this is entirely appropriate given that the Queen has such a strong personal faith. As she herself has said on many occasions, it is her personal faith that guides her actions and her life.

"To many of us our beliefs are of fundamental importance. For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life. I, like so many of you, have drawn great comfort in difficult times from Christ's words and example." (Christmas message, 2000)

Whilst it is easy to complain or write off royalty as an historic anachronism we are fortunate to have a Queen who has publically stated her belief in Jesus and takes seriously her role as head of the Church of England. She recognises as so many of us have that there is a better way to live our lives and that trust in Jesus is at the heart of that life. It does not matter who we are or what our circumstances God does not judge by our race, gender, age or any other things we use as humans to divide and discriminate; he judges the heart. When Samuel was called to anoint a new King over Israel, he had to learn the same lesson, that God did not choose the obvious candidates.

"When they arrived, Samuel saw Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed stands here before the Lord." But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart."

1 Samuel 16:6-7

The challenge for us is to ask ourselves what guides our lives and shapes who we are? Do we simply live for ourselves or do we recognise that there is a better way of living that God has provided for us through the death and resurrection of his Son Jesus Christ. The offer to live God's way is constantly available to us but we must choose it. As the writer of the book of Revelation says Jesus stands at the door of our lives and longs for us to let him in.

"Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me."

Revelation 3:20

Whatever our view of the Queen as an earthly monarch, as Christians we believe in a King and a Kingdom which is everlasting and without end. Our service and allegiance is not to the United Kingdom but to God's Kingdom, something our Queen understands and acknowledges. We can and should celebrate the Queen's 70 years of service to our nation shaped by her faith, calling and determination to serve God. We should also remember as Paul taught Timothy, to pray for her and our nation's leaders but remember too that the faith she so often speaks about is available to all of us too.

"I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—for kings, queens and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Saviour, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus."

These state that only floral decorations are appropriate in churchyards. Other ornaments have been, or will be removed and put safely in the corner of the churchyard by the church porch. We deeply regret the distress which this will doubtless engender. It is a matter of bringing the church into line with national regulations determined for churchyards all over the land. There is a difference in regulations between a civic cemetery and churchyards, in part because of the historic position of the church in a parish, and the cost of upkeep of churchyards which is borne, in the main, by those who attend church regularly.
