

FROM THE VICAR

My dear Friends,

The Christian Mind

War - Poverty - Racial Violence - Student Protest - Industrial Unrest. Contemporary world upheaval has reached alarming proportions. None of us dares suggest there is an easy solution to any of the problems. Our leaders do not know which way to turn. Christians appear by their silence to be equally baffled. Thus, the false impression is given that Christianity has nothing of direct importance to say to the modern world. I have just been re-reading Harry Blamires' wellinformed and challenging book, "The Christian Mind" (SPCK), in which he submits that, because we so often fail to be explicit on matters of current import, the world does not know there is a Christian mind - "we have become afraid of our convictions", and forgotten that Christianity is not a matter of opinion, but a matter of fact. Our task at St. Paul's must be to equip Christians in every part of their thinking to distinguish between right and wrong, between good and evil, and, wherever necessary, with grace and clarity to speak out.

I must pay tribute to Mr. Norman Weeks and Mr. Edmund Wheble on their retirement as Church Wardens at the recent Annual Meeting. As a Church, we would like to assure them of our very real gratitude for all that they have done over many years, as we wish them God's continuing blessing in their life and witness among us. Equally, we congratulate Mr. Derrick Blacker and Mr. Alan Hunt on their election as Wardens, and I know that we shall all give to them our support in prayer and co-operation once they are admitted to the office by the Archdeacon of Bromley on a date which I hope soon to announce.

Perhaps it was the threat of a power-cut which discouraged others from coming but for those who did come, candle or torch in hand it proved a very good meeting.

New Church Wardens

In the Annual Vestry Meeting which began the evening, the important business was the election of Church Wardens. Mr. Grinham told the meeting of the intention of Mr. Norman Weeks and Mr. Edmund Wheble not to stand for this office this year, having served 11 and 7 years respectively. Mr. Greensmith thanked them for their hard work during this time.

Two nominations for warden had been received, Mr. Derrick Blacker and Mr. Alan Hunt and these

were accepted as the new wardens.

Thanks and Praise

The Reports opened the Annual Church Meeting which were noticeable for their note of optimism and encouragement. We heard that the condition of the church building apart from a section of the roof was good as also was our bank balance. Indeed the financial aspect of our Church's life last year is one to thank God for.

In a time of the church's adjustment to to-day and in the stresses which must occur and must be accepted, there was a need to stand to-gether so as to be able to stand on our own in society. "Our world needs Jesus Christ and so does our parish", he reminded us.
