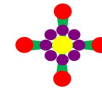

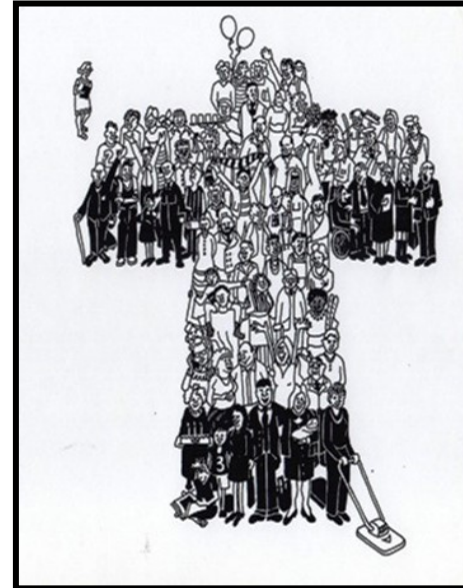

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle - we’ve all heard the saying, what might not be so obvious is that its best to approach them in that order. Recycling is best as a last resort. Plastic in particular is not well suited to recycling. It’s quality deteriorates and so it eventually becomes unrecyclable. In the UK, huge amounts of plastic waste are making a recycling system impossible and much of it is being shipped and dumped abroad. We need a better system and many organisations are campaigning for this. If we can reduce or reuse rather than recycle this will help too.

Recycling is best when rinsed/cleaned. If you have no other option but to recycle here are my tips;
Hard plastics (bottles/tubs etc) - place in home recycling for council collection along with glass/metal/paper Flexible plastics (bags/film/pouches/packets) - Sainsbury’s and Co-op have collection bins in store.
Medication blister packs - Superdrug have a collection bin. Electrical items - council tips have a recycling facility.
