### Welcome to our new vicar

We are delighted to announce that Merton College as Patrons and the Bishop of Southwark have, in consultation with the parish, appointed the Revd Michael Roper to the post of Vicar of St John the Baptist, Malden, subject to the usual legal formalities.

Michael is Priest in Charge of St Barnabas Church, Epsom, in the Diocese of Guildford. Originally from North Carolina, Michael was baptised and confirmed in the Episcopal Church. He came to




London after many years working as a Medical Secretary in the North Carolina Children's Hospital to qualify as a NHS General Practice manager in 1996. During that time he also volunteered at a church-related charity in the East End. Through that experience he was encouraged to pursue ordination training in England and was sponsored and selected by the Bishop of London to train at the College of the Resurrection, Mirfield in 2001. Ordained in Southwark Cathedral, he served his curacy in the Mortlake with East Sheen Team Ministry and was priested by Bishop Richard at St. Mary's, Mortlake in 2004. In 2007 he became Priest in Charge of St. Paul's, Egham Hythe in the Diocese of Guildford. He has extensive experience working with children and families and is deeply committed to the Church's role in social cohesion and inclusion at every level. He is a trustee of OneBodyOneFaith, Inclusive Church, and Love Me Love My Mind, a mental health charity based in Epsom.

It is anticipated that Michael will move to Malden in September and be instituted at St John's by the Bishop of Southwark on 24<sup>th</sup> September.



# St John's Reading Group July 2019

At our June meeting we discussed 'Happiness' by Aminatta Forna. A book which many really enjoyed but one which also left a few wondering whether they had missed something. As our discussion progressed, a few members of the group said that they would read the book again and perhaps see it in a different light. The novel begins with a chance encounter on Waterloo Bridge between Attila, a Ghanaian psychiatrist and



Jean, an American studying urban foxes. A friendship develops when Attila, Jean and a wonderfully diverse group of people join a search for Attila's niece's missing son. Both Attila and Jean have interesting pasts which enable us to understand their attitudes to love, life and humanity's intricate web. A book unlike any other, it has been described as 'a book about humanity's glorious, irreducible mess; a book filled with grief, largesse and joy.' It is a book about priorities – and how important relationships are. We gave it an average score of 7½/10.




For July's meeting, we are reading 'The Fire Court' by Andrew Taylor. This is a sequel to the very popular read in 'The Ashes of London' – set in the aftermath of the Great Fire of London in 1666. The new novel is also set in these turbulent times and the main character, James Marwood sets out to find the truth about his father's death. Then there are several other murders – all linked to The Fire Court, set up to hear claims to land and give permission for the rebuilding of London. Brilliantly researched and very well written, these novels give us a glimpse of life in the 1660s,

just after The Restoration of the monarchy.

Andrew Taylor's third novel in this trilogy, 'The King's Evil' has been published in hardback.

During August, we shall be reading the latest Galbraith novel (Cormoran Strike) which is now released in paperback. Another interesting case for Cormoran and his assistant, Robin.

Our next meeting will be on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> July at 8.00pm in the Coffee Lounge at church.



### WILD KINGSTON at The Rose Theatre 9th June 2019

The Rose was sold out. 800 people were there, eager to celebrate and to learn about Kingston's Wild Life. Presented by Citizen Zoo, which is making wildlife conservation and education a social enterprise, it was a brilliant event.

Excellent speakers. First, George McGavin, with compelling evidence that life on this planet completely depends on the phenomenal work of insects. His advice? Buy a small magnifying glass. SEE insects and begin to grasp the millions of ways we and the whole ecosystem depend on them.

David Lindo, the Urban Birder, the next speaker opened our eyes, ears, hearts and minds to watch nature living and changing around us in our gardens, our cities and our open spaces. On his way to the Rose Theatre that day he had seen 4 Buzzards over Kingston!

Derek Gow spoke about protecting the UK's wildlife habitats. Many habitats are under constant threat. He described the re-introduction of Beavers, Wildcats, Harvest Mice and White Storks. This year he will be advising Citizen Zoo on re-introducing Water Voles to the Hogsmill.

Next we saw the premiere of an outstanding short film on the wild life along the Hogsmill



River. The Hogsmill is the centre of a major conservation project, still in progress on our doorstep. Our river is one of the UK's few chalk streams. Narrated by Griff Rhys Jones, filmed by wildlife photographer Tom Hooker, it shows Kingfishers, Foxes, Badgers, Bats and Damselflies there. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=YNiRlwOqnXQ

Ecologist, Elliot Newton, one of the co-founders of Citizen Zoo spoke next. He helps co-ordinate the development of Kingston's local nature reserves and green spaces. He helped to steer Kingston's investment in the brilliant new Berrylands Nature Reserve. His role is to inspire and educate the Council, the University, the Schools and the Community. And he inspired us.

Not only were there great speakers, but the foyer and the cafe were full of stalls telling us what is happening in Kingston and nationally, and how we can get involved in it.


