Food commonly eaten on VE Day included: Dripping sandwiches Sandwiches made with beef fat Pork faggots Faggots were made from offal wrapped in fat and were served with gravy Homity pie Potato, onion and leeks, topped with cheese Eggless fruit cake Eggs were rationed, so people baked cakes without key ingredients.

In the Second World War, around 5 million men from Britain served in the armed forces, including in the British Army, Royal Air Force and Royal Navy. They fought alongside people from countries around the world, including India, Canada, South Africa and Australia. United States of America and Russia.

Many women also served their country, working in the armed forces or on farms and in factories.

When the war in Europe ended, lots of people began the long journey home. However, many people had died in the war and some people had to stay abroad for months or years after VE Day. Because of this, people felt a lot of different emotions on VE Day.

Nurses are one of the groups working really hard to keep people safe.


Can you colour in the nurse?


When it is safe again, we will all be allowed outside to live our normal lives.
