
Trinity Sunday is the day we celebrate the truth that God is made up of the Father, the Son (Jesus) and the Holy Spirit. You've probably heard all three of those names in some of our prayers and especially when we baptize someone. It's a bit hard to understand. The bible reveals that there is only one God but that this God is made up of three parts, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The word we use to describe this 3 in 1 God is "Trinity." That is a word made up of the word "Tri" which mean 3 (EG A tricycle has 3 wheels) and the word "Unity," which means "One" or being unified together. It is a bit of a mystery that there can be one God yet three parts or persons to God? It makes sense that we humans might not be able to completely understand God. But here are some things that might help us understand how something can be "one" and "three" at the same time. Think of an egg, It is only one egg yet it is made up of three parts (shell, yolk & white). If three children link arms you are joined together. They are so close you are one group. You look like a little community or family. It is made up of three parts but they are so close together they are really one unit. Maybe this is a little like the Trinity. The nice thing about this picture of God is that it is made up of living persons. The wonderful thing about the real God is that he is alive.

Jesus can be our savior and friend, the Holy Spirit can live inside of us and give us life, and we can know the deep love the Father has for us. We are so lucky that the God we serve is known to us in three persons; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Dear God. We know that we cannot fully understand how great and wonderful you really are. But we thank you for revealing yourself to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit (a Trinity of persons) even though you are still one. Help us to learn more about you and the great love you have for each one of us. We ask this in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, Amen!








Many churches have stained glass windows with trinity images.

Pretzel Prayers




I bow my head and tWiSt my arms tight, before I Climb in bed each night.


I Say a prayer to my Father above to give Him thanks and feel His love.














If you have some lollipop sticks you could make a 'Trinity' hanging (ask a grown-up to help you glue the sticks together).





Plaiting uses 3 strings, make yourself a bracelet to remind you of the 3 parts of the Trinity – Father, Son & Holy Spirit.




Or you could make a trinity loaf...
