Reflection

Holidays? Maybe your plans have had to be changed, maybe you're staying in the UK, or maybe you've had a real "staycation" at home. I had a couple of weeks in my static caravan in Suffolk. Our nearest beach is down the road at a tiny village called Dunwich – the dogs can't wait to get there, to swim again and again after a toy. Heaven! Dunwich, tiny now, was a bustling port the size of London back in the day (13th century). That was before 3 storms destroyed the harbour, shipbuilding and most of the rest of Dunwich. And coastal erosion has now taken all but the ruins of a leper hospital and an abbey to leave a pebbly beach on the Suffolk coastal path (and a pub and a museum!).

Interesting, but why tell you this? Because of the Gospel reading. Jesus & his disciples are at Caesarea Philippi, once a major city. It was a place dedicated to the worship of pagan idols, then to the Greek god Pan. Its caves were thought to be the gates to Hades, the underworld. Then the Romans came and made it a centre of power, a garrison city on the trade routes. And the coins at that time had Caesar Philip's head engraved on them.

And <u>here</u> Jesus asks his disciples who they think he is. In a centre of pagan worship, with the might of the Roman empire on display everywhere, Jesus and his dozen followers look pretty weak. Various suggestions come from the disciples, then Peter has it! "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God".

The Christ – The Greek name for the Messiah, longed for by the Jews; *Son of the Living God* – not a pagan statue, nor a Roman ruler.

"Yes Peter, the Gates of Hades shall not prevail against the church I will build on you - the rock."

Today Caesarea Philippi lies in ruins. Today there are more Christians in the world than in all of the past 2000 years put together. *I will build my church*, said Jesus to his disciples, *I will build my church* says Jesus to us today. We needn't look around at the forces and myths of our world, we the church look to God. God, who stands firm while the world turns upside down.

New Testament Reading

Romans 12: 1-8

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God what is good and acceptable and perfect. For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgement, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned.

For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us:

prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Gospel Reading

Matthew 16: 13-20

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. **Glory to you, O Lord**

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples,

'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.'

He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.'

And Jesus answered him, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.'

Then he sternly ordered the disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**
