Greetings!

My first thoughts when I wake up in the morning is often 'What day is it?' or 'What's happening today?' before I propel myself into getting ready to say Morning Prayer. Whilst I am more of a night owl than a lark, these few hours before the busyness of the day comes to the fore are so precious - even more so as the dark mornings are drawing in. I love sitting with God, and sharing my first cup of tea with my Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer. Indeed the peace and quietness of that encounter sustains me for the rest of the day. What are these first moments of the day filled with for you? What is your routine? Our gospel passage for this week reminds us of the 'greatest commandment' to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind." Jesus goes on to say "and the second is like it: you shall love your neighbour as yourself." Many Jews will recite the greatest commandment or the *Shema* as soon as they wake in the morning - these would be the first words they utter each day. It is a practice which becomes a daily reminder to turn back to God....What small tweak could we make to remind ourselves to turn our faces back to God each day? How might turning back to God help us to love those around us as much as we love ourselves?

Old Testament Reading

Leviticus 19: 1-2, 15-18

The Lord spoke to Moses, saying:

'Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel and say to them:

You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy.

You shall not render an unjust judgement; you shall not be partial to the poor or defer to the great: with justice you shall judge your neighbour.

You shall not go around as a slanderer among your people, and you shall not profit by the blood of your neighbour: I am the Lord.

You shall not hate in your heart anyone of your kin; you shall reprove your neighbour, or you will incur guilt yourself.

You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbour as yourself: I am the Lord.'

This is the word of the Lord.

New Testament Reading

1 Thessalonians 2: 1-8

You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, but though we had already suffered and been shamefully maltreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition.

For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.

This is the word of the Lord.

Gospel Reading

Matthew 22: 34-46

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. **Glory to you, O Lord**

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. 'Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?'

He said to him, '"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." This is the greatest and first commandment.

And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself."

On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.'

Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question: 'What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?'

They said to him, 'The son of David.'

He said to them, 'How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying, "The Lord said to my Lord, 'Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet' "?

If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?'

No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**
