REFLECTION

Walk in the Light

Early on Wednesday morning this week I had a simple 'God instance'. For some of us these happen quite regularly, and we can spot them immediately. For me, however, I am always a bit late to the party, and it is only when I look back over my day that I become aware of God working in my life. However, it was obvious at 6.30am on Wednesday, when I put the news on the TV and heard Dan Walker of BBC Breakfast announce that the Archbishop of Canterbury would be live on the show at 8.30am, helping us to make sense of the dreadful landmark number of 100,000 deaths occurring due, in part, to the corona virus.



This is a staggering number, one we can hardly imagine. Wellingborough Borough has a population of just 60,000.

In the interview at 8.30am, Archbishop Justin spoke deeply about how this impact will be felt by millions of people. When asked about hope, he explained how he finds hope in the story of God made real through His son Jesus. How he finds hope in community focus and the unbelievable work of our NHS staff and care workers. How he finds hope in the country looking to reform the world into a better place. A place where we all work to make poverty a thing of the past and to re-balance the divides caused by it.



Grief is something we will all be feeling in some way or other. That sense of impending doom and hopelessness. The Archbishop used careful words to give us all back that hope. He explained how death lies to us. How death says that things will not get better, that we will never rebuild our lives, but God says we will!

We will rebuild our lives, we will start a new, better chapter in our history. But we will only do this if we 'walk in the light' if we become the light of a different world, the energy of new growth and the voices of hope. If we start to nurture within us a desire to make this world a better place, then into this soil we can plant new growth, a new healthier world, a new world of hope, a world where those who have lost their lives to this dreadful virus, and those deeply affected by this loss, will not have suffered, or died, in vain.

God Is Light 1John 1: 5-7

⁵ This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; ⁷ but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

Brothers and sisters let us pray. Nurturing our soil is done through prayer. Let me encourage you to join Rev Morna for morning or evening prayer, be encouraged in our new services and in those God instances we become more aware of.

First Reading

Malachi 3: 1-5

Thus says the Lord God:

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears?

For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years. Then I will draw near to you for judgement; I will be swift to bear witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired workers in their

wages, the widow, and the orphan, against those who thrust aside the alien, and do not fear me, says the Lord of hosts..

Second Reading

Hebrews 2: 14-18

Since the children share flesh and blood, Jesus himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Gospel Reading

Luke 2: 22-40

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. **Glory to you, O Lord**

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. (as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.'

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, 'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.' And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealedand a sword will pierce your own soul too.' There was also a prophet. Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband for seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**
