NOTICE IS GIVEN that we are applying to the Consistory Court of the diocese for permission to carry out the following:

The construction of an extension to the south side of the church for a meeting room, accessible toilet, kitchen and storage. The extension will be of steel-frame and stone construction with slate tiled roof, and connected to the church by a newly formed entrance in the south wall of the nave, with a oak glazed door.

In addition, an oak boarded door will be fitted to an existing open doorway in the east wall of the vestry to an ancillary room. Three pews will be disposed of from the south west corner of the nave.

All in accordance with Pearce Bottomley Architects drawings nos. 4604-[-]-A-0021 & 4604-[-]-A-22 and construction notes.
