REFLECTION

Strangers, we have all been strangers at one time or another. Going for a job interview and knowing no-one, then when you get the job the only person you know is the boss, but it is not long before you get to know the people you are working with. Jacobs' sons did not recognise the stranger before them, he was an Egyptian official, so why should they, but Joseph knows who they are. His brothers having heard nothing for more than 10 years, assumed he was dead. Joseph knows that God had used him in order for Egyptian policy to save his family from the famine and provide food for them.

From the gospel reading we have the Canaanite woman, not someone Jesus and his disciples should be talking with. She is persistent, Jesus is not rude to her with the banter he uses between the two of them. She knows who Jesus is, she knows he can do a miracle in her daughters' life and she has had some contact with those from the Jewish community. Out of her mouth comes what is expected of a person of faith. She knows what Jesus is capable of and she expects him to do the same for her daughter. Before this story Jesus is talking about the attitudes we have to life, that either bring out good behaviour or bad unholy behaviour. The Canaanite woman is pushed by her daughters' illness, out of her comes faith that Jesus can make a difference.

Joseph is pushed, he is pushed in all sorts of ways, by all sorts of forces and spends some time in Pharaohs' prison. At each and every turn and twist in the story of Joseph, he can see the hand of God at work in his life. The result is he is the best he can be in each situation, he is not afraid of what the interpretations of the dreams are, he is not afraid of Pharaohs' response which may not have been favourable. Joseph could not know what the outcome would be and does not run away from the responsibility he is given, he rises to the challenge among strangers.
