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## **廿 READING** Luke 21:25-36

'There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

Then he told them a parable: 'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

#### **☆** REFLECTION

When was the last time you had to wait?(!)

Waiting is often a very passive experience. For instance; you may have had to wait for a bus or a train. Once you're at the stop or the station there's nothing much you can do except wait. You may have had the experience of waking up much earlier than you had intended or wanted and couldn't get back to sleep. There's not much you can do but wait for morning. That's passive waiting – I'm sure you can think of other examples.

But there is another kind of waiting:

Waiting for the birth of a baby is something that parents are fully involved in; they're active in their waiting. At the moment I'm sure we're all waiting for Christmas. Many of you will be very involved in that waiting with lists of things to do, to buy, to plan. That's active waiting.

Advent is a time for waiting. It's active waiting; it's a time of preparation. It is not simply a time to prepare for a celebration – the biggest birthday party anyone ever gets – it is that, but it's not just that. Advent is a time of active waiting and preparation to celebrate Jesus' birth, the coming of God among his people, and his presence among us now. But it is also the time when we recall that we are always waiting for his return – preparing, being ready. That waiting for his return is also active waiting.

It is not waiting like waiting for a bus that may be timetabled even if it may not come on time; it is not waiting like waiting for Christmas which is always 25 December; it is a little like waiting for the birth of a baby – you have to be ready but you don't know exactly when it will be, though even then you have a due date, but as the time approaches you begin to know the signs.

Jesus describes it a little like that. He talked about recognising the signs just as you recognise the signs of the approach of summer by the fig trees (and other trees) coming into leaf. So there are signs of his coming. But the key part of Jesus' advice about how we engage in this waiting is to 'be alert'. Be alert. I always think of the bumper sticker that I have on my trombone case: Be Alert: your country needs lerts. Be alert.

We've reached the 'yes but how?' moment haven't we? You're screaming at the screen. Yes, I know I have to watch; Yes, I know I have to be alert; Yes, I know I have to be ready – *but how*? What is it I'm looking for? Even when it gets really practical, I think metaphor can help. You're watching for light amid the darkness. It is a dark time of year so a good time to think in these terms. We live in dark times: Conflict between nations and within nations; conflict between communities and neighbours and families and within communities and families; Breakdown in relationships at all levels; Famine and deprivation, poverty and oppression, hunger and disease; Interest only in personal advantage; the evaporation of concern for others; an obsession only with emptiness or vacuous trivia sometimes giving a quick fix but no long-term satisfaction; People held in slavery and forced labour, exploited for their desperation for work, for money, for their family, for their bodies ... people living in hopeless despair amid death and destruction; Some darkness caused by natural events and disasters which may or may not be increasing because of human action over many years; Some darkness caused directly by human action – what we could call human inhumanity.

We watch for the coming of Jesus as a watchman looks for the morning. A watchman looking for morning looks in the right direction (east) and keeps looking, straining for the first signs of light from below the horizon. Or, back with Jesus' metaphor, you look at the barren twigs of the fig tree watching for the first signs of the bids that will form leaves. That helps us, back with the light in the darkness metaphor, with what we're alert for the first signs of?

We look for the first signs of dawn; we look for the first glimmers of light above the horizon; we look for light breaking into the darkness: People recovering for illness, People rebuilding their lives; The healing of relationships; reconciliation between people and families and communities and nations; Peace talks and peace treaties; People treated with dignity and compassion; Relief arriving in disaster zones and people being fed and clothed and sheltered; Swords being turned into ploughshares and spears into pruning hooks, weapons being dismantled and human energy and economic activity going into relief and measures that lead to life and health and peace; Glimpses of joy on the faces of children receiving gifts and love when they have been used only to abuse and being taken advantage of. Forgiveness and rehabilitation instead of revenge. Grace and mercy rather than vindictive hatred.

Look for light, long for the coming of morning, keep watching because the light is coming, but don't wait passively as if asleep: be alert.

The next step is to celebrate the light when you see it and be part of the spread of the light and of the good news of the light. When you see that light you know that the day is near; you see the Son of Man coming in glory; as people of light you stand before him as he 'comes in the cloud'; the Kingdom of God is near. Walk as people of light, support and be involved in the activities of light.

Watch as the watchman for the morning and be determined to walk in light, demonstrating light, bringing light in the dark places.

Longing for light, we wait in darkness. Come let us walk in the light of the Lord. **Amen**
