COVID 19...TIER 3.....new protocols

From next week there will be a temp check before entering church buildings

Wear a mask at all times in church: even when no one is present. (not if you are helping conducting worship)

Sign in for track and trace

Do put your mask in a bag if taking it off and not on a surface ...please.

Do not mingle with others in the building after worship or a support group ...do not all try to leave at the same time.

INTERRUPTIONS: Reflecting on Impact of Covid time during this next period Individually and as a Church Community

I wonder if you are asking what this Covid period has taught us? You might be thinking about all that we have lost as well as what we might have gained. For each of us this experience will be different. Rowan Williams, our former archbishop, has written a very thoughtful book called "Candles in the darkness". You might want to read it.

He ends with asking a very simple question: when we have emerged from the shadow of the pandemic what will we have learned? Like all his questions they take much time to answer thoughtfully, truthfully, and in a way that might allow us to be transformed by God and the experience.

So from next week we invite each one of you to come on a journey of discovery....

By reflecting on psalms, pictures, gospel passages and Celtic prayer we will think through what effect this Covid interruption has caused in our lives and the lives of our community and churches.

JOURNALING: one of the ways that people often reflect is by a process of journaling..... Simply a note book or sketch pad into which you record your responses. You might want to paint, draw, stick photos in, write poetry or a prayer. You might try to make your response in a way that you have not tried before....having a go at drawing...or taking photos.


The journal is a personal journal of your thinking about this time of interruptionyou might want to share an insight or thought ...but it is for you and God primarily.
