

Read Psalm 105: it tells of the history of Israel and reminds people that God was present throughout their history . What verse or theme stands out to you? I wonder why

Our time line

Create a timeline of global or local events over your life time. Divide the time line into decades perhaps. What impact have these events had on the world and on your life. What are the things that you wish to say thank-you for?

How do we see people, made in the image of God, behave and respond in the difficulties and challenges that we often see on the world stage courage, determination, anger, compassion for example?

Write a few verses of psalm that reflects how your remember these times.

Personal journey

- 1. Think back though your life. You may want to draw a timeline and divide it into decades.
- 2. Put onto the time line significant events in your life or the time that you have lived
- 3. Use colours to express your experience of encounter with God at different times of your life or your experience of encounter with God in this moment. You can use crayons, paints or even different fabrics.
- 4. Write your own remembrance psalm, telling your own story of the people, places and events through which you have experienced God's active presence in your life. You may wish to create your own visual psalm of remembrance as a collage using photos, images, cards, words and whatever else helps you be mindful of God alongside you in the past and God with you now.

- 2 Sing to him, sing praises to him; tell of all his wonderful works.
- 3 Glory in his holy name;

let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice.

5 Remember the wonderful works he has done.

Super Soup Team recipe Two portions:

One onion

One small leek
Two cloves of garlic
Two medium-size
carrots
One large potato
A 300 to 400 gram
jar of tomato pasta sauce
0.5 litres vegetable stock
Salt and pepper to taste
Ground coriander 1 teaspoon
Chopped fresh coriander if possible
Small tub of natural yoghurt

Sauté chopped onion, garlic and leek.
Add chopped carrots and potato.
Add pasta sauce and stock.
Season with salt, pepper & coriander.
Bring to boil, simmer for approximately 20 minutes.
Liquidise.
Serve with yoghurt stirred into the bowl.
