I wonder which one calls to you? Are you a Martha or a Mary? I wonder which one fits best?


The story before the Bible reading we have just read is the well-known Good Samaritan which ends "Go, and do thou likewise"

Confused by the hopes and fears of her people, a Jewish servant in The Praetorium clearly knows more than she should. Pilate wrestles with a quandary of his own devising, while outside momentum is gathering – the power of the capitol in tension with the will of the people.

COVID Winter Grant

For many people, winter brings additional hardships, as heating bills go up, and houses suffer more from damp or cold. If you work with people who might be struggling particularly with the harsh weather, check out this list of <u>advice and support sources</u>. Financial help can be given in the following areas:

- Food
- Energy and water bills for household purposes and sewerage
- Other essentials (including sanitary products, warm clothing, soap, blankets, boiler service/repair, purchase of equipment including fridges, freezers, ovens, etc.)

All grants must be allocated by the end of March. So please make sure you identify households you're working with and make the requests now, so they don't miss out.

To apply for the COVID Winter Grant: For items relating to home heating, such as fuel bills or breakdown in heating equipment such as oil tanks or boiler repair, please contact Community Energy Plus by emailing advice@cep.org.uk or phoning 0800 954 1956.
