- 1. Whose world is it anyway? Are the resources of the world used and shared appropriately with all? Are we caring for our world and its people?
- 2. How do we resolve differences of opinions and views? How do we listen deeply to each other. How can Restorative Justice strategies help overcome conflicts?

WISDOM GROUPS: ASCENSION TIME

Readings: John 17: 6-19 and Acts 1: 1-11

- 1. I wonder what word or phrase sticks out for you as you read these texts?
- 2. As you read the gospel reading what insights or thoughts do you have about the conversation Jesus has with God the Father? What feeling and emotions come though?
- 3. Can you imagine having such an honest and heartfelt conversation with God? You might have had such conversations at points in your life when you have set out on a new direction: move home, job, retirement, medical treatment.
- 4. When we have to leave things behind and do or go somewhere new how does that feel....those things we leave, what is our prayer and hope.
- 5. Do you see this reading as the "end of Jesus' life" conversation or the start of something new?: how might this help us in this present time?

Background notes:

This John reading has often been called The priestly prayer of Jesus. Throughout the Gospels we often see Jesus at prayer but rarely hear his words. So here we encounter Jesus praying to his Father for the disciples. He asks 4 things of God the Father for his disciples:

- 1. Unity....that they should be one
- 2. Joy
- 3. Protection
- 4. That they should be able to fulfil their mission

UPDATE FROM PCCS and CORE STAFF GROUP

Here are some of the topics discussed:

- 1. Transition: "Our shared meal" which has been delivered 3 times a week to homes to root into church buildings so that we can eat together. Wednesday, pasties at St Peter church Newlyn. Fish and chips on Friday at St John church Penzance. If you would like to help with the setting up and running of this café project contact a church warden.
- 2. Opening of Playzone: next steps to set up a grandparent and child group, a who let the dads group and a chill out group. Would you be prepared to go on a rota?
- 3. Worship Leaders: we are about to start the preparation and training of more worship leaders. Please pray for the people who will be serving our churches in this way.
- 4. New marriage regulations: These have come into force across England. We will no longer be able to issue wedding certificates on the day of the marriage. But for the first time in history the name of a mother or step parents will be able to be recorded on the marriage certificate.
- 5. We noted that there will be a HeartEdge conference in the cluster in September. Also we expect to be piloting a new course written by Sam Wells and will be training leaders to do so.
- 6. Café style worship will become a new feature at St John PZ and this will have a contemporary themewatch this space.
- 7. Peter rabbit and the G7 schools project. Preparations for this are going well and we have lots of volunteers.
- 8. Covid testing and reopening. We will soon be redoing our risk assessment for the next stage of covid reopening. But we must make sure that everyone feels safe.
