NEWS FROM CORE STAFF MEETING AND PCCs this month: Headlines

- **Review of Schools day**: Good to see people from all 4 churches together to make this a very memorable day for us and schools. Dream catchers will be on display in all churches. Next half term theme: THE OLYMPICS:
- This will link the weekly schools' assemblies, holiday clubs and focus day (which will be held at Paul)
- **Intern**: Derath informs us that all is on track for Intern Hillary Tan from Malaysia to join the penlee cluster in the Autumn
- **Environmental Response**: To ensure that each church has a champions and that there is an agenda item on each month. Recycled clothes sale and G7 prayers and wave of hope happening this month. Send Hand prayers from cluster and church schools to Carbis Bay
- **Our shared meal project** . Very successful project which demonstrated prayerful concern and hospitality. Much appreciated. In SEPTEMBER there will be some physical "shared meal cafes" happening across cluster churches.
- **Training and courses**: Safe guarding, food hygiene level 1, fire safety, equality and diversity have all taken place. Coming up: worship leading, Sam Wells:"With us" course, : Need for First Aid training to be set up
- **Grant making workshops. "Meet the funders**". This was an excellent 2 day training course set up by Transformation Cornwall. So pleased that some from the cluster attended. Now making a list of the projects that we need to apply for funding for. PCCs now considering this with SY.
- **St John Church**: to apply for faculty permission for new toilet, enlarged kitchen, Multi sensory room and parking
- **St Peter's**: apply for faculty permission to remove organ. Last legal issues sorted to allow sale of hall. Church Floor to be raised in August. Join parish giving scheme
- St Mary: Join parish giving scheme. Explore disability access.
- **On the way**. Very few positive comments about process. But people working hard to engage and number of people in deanery focus groups
- Holiday clubs and Playzone: All churches are supporting these ventures. Much fund raising and donations already received. All themes set, coordinator in place thanks to the generosity of St Mary and St Paul Trustees. Finance. Events at Playzone for under 7's with parents this year. Now getting bookings, hire staff and look for volunteers

Helpful and engaging article by Fr Richard Rohr as we journey "On the Way" Letting Go of What Used to Be

God is doing new things, Jesus proclaimed, but only those with new minds and hearts can see a new world breaking through the cracks of the old.

If evolution is the language of growth and change, then an evolving faith is one that accepts and even embraces change. While the word change normally refers to new beginnings, real transformation happens more often when something falls apart. The pain of something old cracking apart or unraveling invites us to evolve instead of tightening our controls and certitudes. Episcopal priest Stephanie Spellers is a leading thinker on change and growth in the church, and sees the current challenges of church and society as way of God "cracking open" people for greater possibility:

Institutions and cultures are durable partly because they obey the law of inertia. [1] Even if you think you've exerted a strong external push and knocked a moving object or an entire institution off its set course, wait. Just wait. With barely a nudge, the object will drift right back to its original path.

Think of your own experience. When you see a crack, what's your first instinct? Push the pieces back together and patch it over. Eventually a contractor comes with the bad news: there is deep damage here, and if you don't address it, before long the whole structure will be fundamentally compromised. You sigh and negotiate. I don't know about you, but I have a surprising capacity to delude myself about how broken the structure is. With enough duct tape and rope, I will get back to normal. [I call this "rearranging the deck chairs on the Titanic!"]

So it is for a nation and a church. In the midst of displacement, destabilization, and decentering, Americans and church folks have been tempted to replace, restabilize, and recenter. Let's return to the building. Let's encourage the protesters to come off the streets. . . . Let's move past division. Let's re-establish majority Christianity in its former, privileged cultural post. Or we could acknowledge the unravelling, breaking, and cracking [Richard: what we are calling "unveiling" in this year's meditations] as a bearer of truth and even a gift. Perhaps, as [Alan] Roxburgh suggested, the Holy Spirit has been nudging and calling Christians "to embrace a new imagination, but the other one had to unravel for us to see it for what it was. In this sense the malaise of our churches has been the work of God." [2] . . . A church that has been humbled by disruption and decline may be a less arrogant and presumptuous church. It may have fewer illusions about its own power and centrality. It may become curious. It may be less willing to ally with the empires and powers that have long defined it. It may finally admit how much it needs the true power and wisdom of the Holy Spirit. That's a church God can work with.
