## **Wisdom in the Community Notes: John 6:24-35**

### **Read through the passage, what are your first thoughts?**

Once the crowd realised that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into the boats and went to Capernaum in search of Jesus.

### **Jesus the Bread of Life**

When they found him on the other side of the lake, they asked him, “Rabbi, when did you get here?” Jesus answered, “Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed, but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval.” Then they asked him, “What must we do to do the works God requires?” Jesus answered, “The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent.” So they asked him, “What sign then will you give that we may see it and believe you? What will you do? Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written: ‘He gave them bread from heaven to eat.’” Jesus said to them, “Very truly I tell you, it is not Moses who has given you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is the bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.” “Sir,” they said, “always give us this bread.” Then Jesus declared, “I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.”

**Now read it through a second time** – what are your thoughts now? If you were in that crowd that day, what would you be thinking? You’ve seen Jesus feed a huge crowd and walk on water at the beginning of this chapter – then Jesus and his disciples had disappeared.

Would your first thought be to go off in search of Jesus? And why Capernaum? Why did they ask Jesus when he got there? How would you have felt when, instead of giving you a straight answer - He criticised you for only following him because you’d been well fed? For being more concerned about the physical and temporal benefits of physical food, and not for the satisfying of your spiritual hunger? The crowd had seen the miracle – but failed to understand it.

And what do you make of this verse – “Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval.” Jesus used the title ‘the Son of Man’ about himself, why do you think that was?

How would you have felt about Jesus correcting you as a member of that Jewish crowd, that it was not Moses who had fed the Israelites with bread from heaven in the wilderness but God who had fed them. The crowd then ask Jesus to always give them “this bread” Can you think of a similar question asked of Jesus elsewhere in the scriptures? \*

Was Jesus purposely saying in the final verse “I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.” In order to make the crowd think of an Old Testament word for God? (I AM, read Exodus 3:14)

\*the Samaritan woman at the well in John 4:13-15 .....“Sir, give me this water so that I don’t get thirsty”.....

What do you think God is telling you personally in this passage? If you’re not sure - ask Him in prayer.

Is there anything in this passage that has challenged you in any way? If so take it to God in prayer.

Shine on me, shine on me

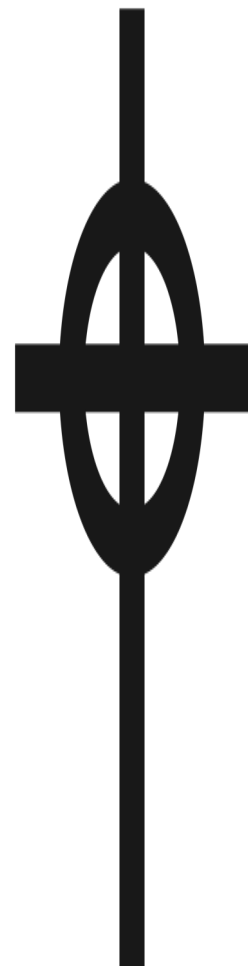
As we gaze on your kingly brightness

## COVID: NEXT STEPS

We are very aware that the prospect of returning to life as near to normal by the next few weeks have very mixed reactions in our congregations. So we are trying to find a solution to cater for as many needs as possible and to allow as many as possible to feel comfortable to worship in our churches.

So:

1. Clergy and other staff will continue to test for Covid twice a week and wear masks when distributing communion
2. Hand sanitiser will still be used when entering church and receiving communion.
2. Communion will still be offered in one kind: no chalice
3. An area of each church will still be marked up for social distancing
4. The peace will not be shared by handshakes....so as we are at the moment
5. We will ask that people respect each other's needs for social distancing and mask wearing
6. We are suggesting that although we can sing again that we have a hymn/song sung by everyone at the beginning and end of worship only so that those who are anxious can join us after the first hymn and leave before the last one. These hymns and songs will be on the newsletter and screen so that books do not have to be used.
7. We will encourage people still to have refreshments after worship seated at tables
