Wisdom in the Community Notes: Mark 7 v 1-8 , 14- 15 and 21 -23

Context – The passage comes straight after Jesus has fed 5000 people out in the countryside. And the Phari-sees are criticising him for eating a meal without the required ceremonial cleansing. These Religious leaders of the day often gave Jesus a hard time. Can you think of any such occasions ?

From the Pharisees point of view ...So for a moment try to see it from their point of view. So put on your Pharisees robe and think back to the synagogue on the Sabbath when Jesus cured the man with the withered hand. Surely to keep faith with your God you have to show this miracle worker the error of his ways. Or think back to that meal when he ate with all those tax collectors who had turned traitor by working for the Roman occupier. Surely you are right to express your indignation at such behaviour. And as you watch the disciples hand out the food to the crowds surely you are right to be cross at the way that Jesus and his friends are flaunting the traditions of the elders. Can you have any sympathy for the Pharisees?

Now think of a time when you have judged other people? Do you think differently now about this?

Religious Ceremonial and Rituals – A key issue this story raises is about the positive and negative sides of reli-gious rituals and ceremonies. For the Pharisees the ceremonial washing could be a strong reminder of their distinctive national identity when under a tyrannical dictatorship like the Sandana Catalan dance in Barcelona. Or is it just another reason for them to feel superior over the disciples of Jesus ?

Think of your own rituals in church. Are they a sincere witness to our heartfelt piety? Or are these actions just an outward substitute for the true worship of the heart?

What defiles a person ? Our current society is very concerned about Food Safety. Sometimes people even worry about the safety of 'home cooking'. What we are much less fussy about is what we are prepared to fill our minds with from television, social media and the internet without thinking about it. Research from the USA claimns that by the age of 18 each child will have watched 16,000 simulated murders. And there has been speculation that one of the factors behind the mass shooting in Plymouth was the content of various websites that the perpretator had been influenced by. If we want to be clean in God's eyes then perhaps each of us has to ask if there are things which we should no longer choose to watch as our entertainment ?

I have been privileged to share in worship with many people from different faith traditions and all have nurtured me in my faith journey.

On my life's journey, the Bible has always been an important part of my life through faith, academic and sheer delight at the variety of stories shared by different writers within it, all inspired by their love and faith in God.

Different translations have contributed to this journey, Authorised, Revised Standard Version, Jerusalem Bible, JB Phillips Paraphrase, Amplified Bible. Good News Bible, New Revised Standard Version and many others that I have enjoyed or have intrigued and puzzled me by their language.

Now I have just purchased through Amazon a copy of the Passion Bible. Like all versions one could get into the debate on translation from Hebrew and Greek the accuracy but the bible with its many books was compiled to tell stories for us, and then with our enthusiasms for us to share.

I first met the Passion Bible at the 21,000 Christian Celebrations Hillsong Church Conference in the 02 Centre in London. Worshipping with 21,000 all age folk was both thrilling and inspiring as worshipping with four people in a Chapel in the countryside of rural Oxfordshire was some fifty years ago as we sang in worship together, but I mustn't digress, as I am prone too.

This week the Passion Bible dropped through my letterbox, purchased through Amazon. (If you want cheap second hand books, may I also recommend Abe Books found through Google, while the Edge of the World Bookshop in Penzance, gives us the opportunity to see, read and feel the pages of the books!) Adverts over!!!!!

The Passion Bible (published New Testament only), is an easy read for our armchair. May I recommend it to you as a new and different way to enjoy the Bible, just as story telling has encaptured thousands of imaginations throughout the years.

To keep everyone up to date with the plans about the deanery

Dear PCC Secretaries, Deanery Synod Reps, Churchwardens and Clergy,

We are writing to update you on the On the Way Penwith timetable.

The On the Way Penwith Leadership Group met with the Bishops, the Archdeacons and Simon Cade, the Diocesan Secretary on Monday, 2 August.

We presented our draft plan and received feedback.

We were complimented on the work that had gone into the plan, on the creative ideas that had emerged and, in particular, the level of consultation with the parishes.

We were asked to do some more thinking about a number of issues including governance and the models of ministry that we are proposing.

The Leadership Group has subsequently met to do this work and we are preparing an updated plan to share with the Bishops and the consultation document that we will send to PCCs.

The timetable is as follows:

• Leadership Group will meet in the second week of September to sign off the draft Deanery Plan and the PCC Consultation document which will include a number of options for you to consider.

• The PCC Consultation document (including the decision(s) we are asking you to make) will be sent to PCCs during the week beginning 27 September

• Please arrange to hold your PCC meeting during the two weeks 4 – 18 October (you can book the date as soon as you like)

- PCCs are asked to report your decision(s) by 22 October
- The Leadership Group will meet during the week beginning 25 October to consider your responses and develop the final plan based on those responses.
- The final plan will then be circulated to Deanery Synod Reps during the week beginning 1 November.

• The Synod Meeting, at which the formal vote will be taken, will be held during the week beginning 22 November. We will confirm the date of this as soon as possible.

The details of voting rights (proxy, postal etc.) will be confirmed in due course.

We will be restarting the fortnightly online Deanery Prayer meetings in September – more information will follow.

We also plan to hold a **Call to Pray for Penwith**, probably on a Saturday before the Synod meeting – again more information will follow soon.
