Archaeological excavations outside the Chapel of Saint Peter ad Vincula

Last year, HRP conducted an archaeological excavation outside the Chapel Royal of St Peter ad Vincula. During this excavation, performed as part of works to improve access into the building, the team discovered the complete remains of two individuals.

The two skeletons, an adult female and a young child, were found lying on their backs facing up or 'supine' with their feet facing east, typical of normal Christian burial practice. The team found coffin nails surrounding the adult female, suggesting she was interred within a coffin. No similar evidence was found surrounding the child and so it is likely they were simply wrapped in a blanket or 'shrouded' prior to being buried.

The burials were cut through a possible medieval mortar floor surface that could be the remains of Edward I's chapel in the Tower, constructed between 1286-7. The date of these remains, based upon their position within the sequence of soil or 'stratigraphy' of the area, is thought to be between 1450 and 1550.

The remains, after being analysed, were reinterred in the crypt of the chapel at a special ceremony conducted by The Reverend Canon Roger Hall MBE on 10 September 2019.
