Dear friends,

Pentecost, or Whit-Sunday as it's called in the Book of Common Prayer, comes fifty days after Easter. The Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples in the upper room above the building which is today called David's tomb. As the Holy Spirit was poured upon the disciples, one of the gifts they received was that of speaking other languages.

The gift of speaking (or signing) to communicate is precious, important and life changing. Without language, we are a diminished people. It is therefore no wonder that the first gift of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost was that of language. Here in London, it is said that there are over 270 different languages spoken throughout the city. Many of us are surrounded by people who speak in a different language; you need only travel on the bus or tube to bear witness to that! On the first day of Pentecost, all present received a glimpse of what heaven would be like: a place full of people speaking different tongues but with complete mutual comprehension.

In the Book of Common Prayer, we variously use the words 'comforter' and 'advocate' to describe the Holy Spirit; Jesus wanted the disciples to be consoled after his death. From that moment they felt empowered and ready to go out and preach the Gospel. This is the same today: we are baptised in the Holy Spirit and charged to bring the Good News to the poor and lonely and to those without hope.

Poem and prayer of the week

Bishop John Cosin was born in 1594, in Norwich. He attended Norwich Grammar School and Gonville and Caius College Cambridge. After ordination and appointments in County Durham, he was elected Bishop of Durham in 1600. He was married and had five children. Bishop John Cosin played a prominent part in the committee which revised the 1549 Book of Common Prayer, later established in 1662 as the authorised liturgical prayer book of the Church of England, and is responsible for some of the collects. A theologian and writer, he wrote several books of poetry, one of which contained the poem *Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire*. Today it is best known as a hymn sung at Pentecost or Whit-Sunday to the tune *Veni Creator*. This beautiful poem goes right to the heart of Pentecost.

> Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire, and lighten with celestial fire; thou the anointing Spirit art, who dost thy sevenfold gifts impart:

Thy blessèd unction from above is comfort, life, and fire of love; enable with perpetual light the dullness of our blinded sight:

Anoint and cheer our soiled face with the abundance of thy grace: keep far our foes, give peace at home; where thou art guide no ill can come.

Teach us to know the Father, Son, and thee, of both, to be but One; that through the ages all along this may be our endless song,

Praise to thy eternal merit, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.
