## Poem of the week

Lucille Clifton grew up in Buffalo, New York and attended Howard University. Her great-great-grandparents were originally from the kingdom of Dahomey, now Benin, and she was very proud of this ancestry. She married a professor of philosophy and sculpture. Her first book of poetry was published in 1969 and was well received. During her career, Clifton held several prestigious academic posts and received many prizes for her poetry. This poem, *Oh antic God*, focuses on images of, and her longing for, her dead mother. It is a mental postcard of her childhood, full of warmth, and with a one-line shock.

### Oh antic God

Oh antic God  
return to me  
my mother in her thirties  
leaned across the front porch  
the huge pillow of her breasts  
pressing against the rail  
summoning me in for bed.

I am almost the dead woman's age times two.

I can barely recall her song  
the scent of her hands  
though her wild hair scratches my dreams  
at night. Return to me, oh Lord of then  
and now, my mother's calling  
her voice humming my name.

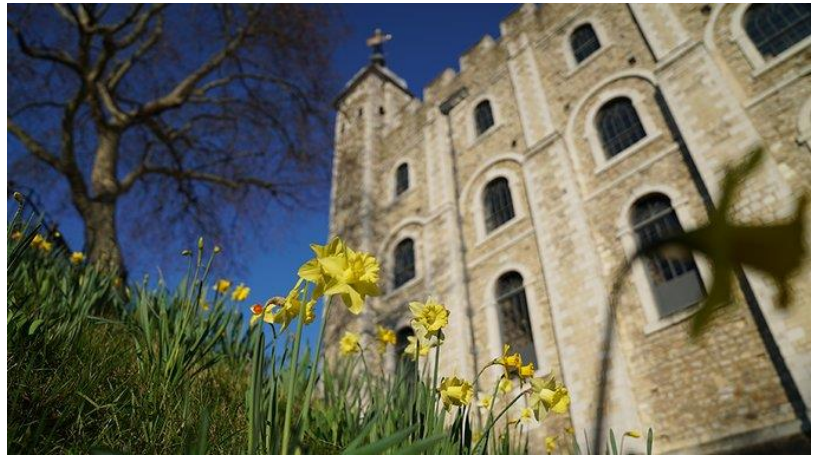


## Historic Royal Palaces
