In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.' The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!' Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.' Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

#### Romans 8:121-17

Brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh – for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, 'Abba! Father!' it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ – if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

# Gospel Reading: John 3:1-17

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about

heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.'

# Ukrainian Icons on Ammunition Boxes I6<sup>th</sup> June – 7<sup>th</sup> July

Following an exhibition at our Cathedral, we are delighted to host an exhibition in our church from 16<sup>th</sup> June to 7<sup>th</sup> July. This is an art project which is both an exhibit and an opportunity to buy these exquisite Icons written by two Ukrainian artists on fragments from ammunition boxes from the war zones in Ukraine. The icons will be on sale and priced between £1800 and £8000. The money raised will be given in support of the frontline medical aid needed in Ukraine. There will be an official launch reception on **Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> June from 7pm to 9pm** in church and we shall hear a brief introduction to Icons, their import in worship and their power to direct our prayers as is expressed most clearly in our Orthodox churches. Please do put this in your diaries now.

Each day, as we open church, we should like to offer refreshments to our visitors and wonder if we might be able to sell some cake and tea/coffee. If you would be willing to help man the church and/or make cake for sale, please could you sign up at the back of church - the sign up sheet is on the notice board by the Who's who at the West Wall. Update: There will be public events to accompany the exhibition. Already confirmed is a talk on Friday 28 June at 1.30pm by a Swissborn iconographer Verena Watson, about 'The process of

writing or painting an icon.' The exhibition and the talk are free, but voluntary donations for medical aid to Ukraine will be welcome.

## **Bible Study**

Our next Bible Study Group follows this Friday's Monthly Lunch. It will be led by David Greenwood. The story of David and Bathsheba is one of the most powerful tales in the Hebrew Bible. It is the harrowing story of the fall of one of the most attractive figures in the Bible, David, into sin and the consequences that flow from that fall. It is about the abuse of power and the speaking of truth to that power. It is also a profound statement about the nature of repentance and the justice and mercy of God. It is also a cracking page turner! If you wish to prepare, the relevant passages are 2 Samuel 11 and 12 and Psalm 51.
