## **The Churchyard Code**

Anne, Travers and David have just written to all those whose loved ones are buried or remembered in our churchyard, to send them a copy of the latest version of our leaflet "The Churchyard Code" which summarises the rules of the churchyard. These rules are set by the Diocese, and are part of English law. We are aware that there are many items currently on graves which are not allowed to be there, so we are having a Spring Tidy-Up in the churchyard, and we are asking everyone to read the new leaflet carefully and then to remove any items which are not allowed. It is important that we do move towards complying with the law, over time, out of respect for the people and the place.

We know that different people grieve in different ways, and that removing cherished items from a grave can be hard. # **Thought for the Month by Travers Harpur:**

## Who Do You Think You Are?

How many of us have ancestors who were refugees? My mother's family had Huguenot roots, hence the passing down of the French name Travers. Huguenots were those French people who followed the Reformed faith. At stages of the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> centuries there were large numbers of them in France. In the 16th century there were the wars of religion and St. Bartholomew's night. In 1598 Henri IV of France brought comparative peace and freedom with the Edict of Nantes. Unfortunately, Louis XIV revoked this in 1685 leaving the choice convert, die or escape. My ancestors, probably through what is now North Italy and Switzerland, came to the Netherlands and then in 1690 to County Cork, Ireland. They seemed to have been welcomed, prospered, and integrated (as with most Huguenots in most destinations).

For my 80<sup>th</sup> birthday this month we plan to visit Travers a village in the Val de Travers in Switzerland. This is on the route Huguenots took and may (or may not) be the source of my name, adopted from the transit village. This background struck me when preparing the May mission slot on Iran and the Iranian refugees. My ancestors came to Ireland with a faith they valued and many Iranians are now arriving here with a strong Christian faith. Let us pray for them, the Bible Society and the many Iranian churches in this country.
