'Brothers and Sisters with Nature'

October 4th sees the annual commemoration of the life of that well known saint, Francis of Assisi. The son of a prosperous cloth merchant, he grew up in 'the lap of luxury' - his family's wealth based on a steady trade in fine fabrics, such as silk and linen. Accustomed to a more than 'comfortable' lifestyle, as a young man he lived the life of a typical young nobleman of the time; partying, spending money and staying out late. Then one day, Francis became ill. He was unwell for a while and this period of sickness brought about a significant change in Francis' life. We are told that as he started to recover, he began to spend more time on his own, praying. Whenever he could, he gave his money and food to the poor. Instead of wearing fine, expensive clothes he chose to wear a simple brown woollen tunic and cloak. He began to live much more simply, rebelling against his materialistic upbringing and choosing instead to own nothing, eating only the food that he could beg. Other young men were inspired by this lifestyle, gave up everything and joined him. They became known as 'The Franciscans.' Like Francis, they spent time each day in prayer and went from village to village, supporting the poor and the sick.

Francis' love for animals and bird became legendary and there are many stories, including 'The Wolf of Gubbio,' in which he showed a deep empathy with all living creatures, not least those unable to speak for themselves when persecuted. One day Francis was outdoors, teaching a group of people about God. He began, "What God wants us to do is . . ." The crowd called out, "We can't hear you!" The disturbance preventing the crowd from hearing Francis was a large flock of swallows building their nests nearby and chirping very loudly. "My dear sister swallows," said Francis, "Listen to the word of God and be quiet until I've finished." Incredibly, all the birds flew onto nearby rooftops and trees and were silent. "Thank you," said Francis. "As I was saying, what God wants us to do is to love each other. Be kind to each other. We are all brothers and sisters — even with the animals and birds. That is why I call the swallows 'sisters.'" The swallows made no sound until Francis had finished speaking. Then they began to sing.

It is said that Francis also preached to wolves, fish, worms, spiders, bees and flowers, because they filled him with an overwhelming sense

of God's love. "Give praise to your Creator!" He told them.

One of St. Francis' most enduring legacies is the 'The Canticle of the Sun.' In it, he delights in the connection that he experiences between Nature and God:

"Be praised, my Lord, through all your creatures, especially through my lord Brother Sun, who brings the day; and you give light through him.

"Be praised, my Lord through those who forgive for love of you; through those who endure sickness and trial. Happy are those who endure in peace, for by you, Most High, they will be crowned."

This October, may the life of St.Francis' bring us, too, a sense of deep peace and joy.

We Blew our own Trumpet

On 11th September St Peter's Church Empingham took the opportunity to show off their newly restored organ. The restoration was possible as a result of funding from a National Lottery Heritage Grant and the Church Council were keen to allow organ enthusiasts, far and near, to hear the result.

This first concert, since events were put on hold by the COVID pandemic, not only featured David Hill, conductor, organist and educator, who has a number of roles including Musical Director of the Bach Choir, Associate Guest Conductor of the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra and Professor of Choral Conducting at Yale University, the Royal Academy of Music and the Royal Northern College of Music; it also featured internationally renowned trumpeter Crispian Steele-Perkins. He has recorded with the Academy of Ancient Music, the King's Consort and the English Baroque Soloists. He has played in some of the world's greatest concert halls and came to Empingham to play to a full "house".

Together these famous artists presented a program extending from Mushel to Mozart and Goodall to Gershwin. The evening had an informal and friendly atmosphere as both musicians took time to explain the instruments. Indeed Crispian unraveled the history of the trumpet from the time of Egyptian King Tut to our modern day brass, via a rendition of Handel's Water Music on the garden hose!

On completion of the program a brief encore was played, delighting the audience further, with the theme tune Crispian recorded for the BBC's Antique Roadshow. David Franklin thanked both performers before they and the audience were offered wine and a large selection of canapés, produced by a generous team of friends of St Peter's, led by Tarn Dearden of the PCC. A visitor was heard to say "this is a village with soul".

All in all this first concert on the restored organ was a great success and we were privileged to begin a series of events with such prestigious musicians. Further events are planned over the next few months so please look out for details in future editions of this magazine.



Village Quiz Night Saturday 13 November





RIDLINGTON PLAYING FIELD UPDATE SEPTEMBER 2021:

Results of the Playing Field Questionnaire that was circulated in the latter part of last year are now available to read on the website. We would like to thank Suzanne Baines again for all her hard work in the design, compilation, distribution and collation of all the documentation and to all of you who responded.

The analysis of the questionnaire together with the annual ROSPA Safety Inspection Report was discussed at our first Action Group Meeting at the end of September. The outcome of these discussions and the priorities and future plans will be taken forward by the trustees and dedicated Action Groups. Please do let us know if you would like to be involved. We are in the process of setting up a trustees email address which we will put on the website very soon.

The Field. We would like to thank Russell and Dawn once again for gathering the hay from the field. We know that so many of you missed the field as it was and are aware that leaving the grass to grow curtailed your enjoyment and regular activities. We thank you for bearing with us over the last 18 months and with the decisions that we made as a result of the ongoing pandemic. Your feedback has been greatly appreciated and noted and we will ensure that regular mowing and maintenance of the field will be resuming as we go forwards.

We are however, planning to let the periphery of the field continue to rewild as we know from your feedback that this gives pleasure to so many in the village as well as helping nature to flourish. The new saplings are growing well within this area too.

We would like to thank Karen and Richard Baines as they continue to do a sterling job as volunteers within the playing field especially in the wooded areas around the periphery. They and their team have worked so hard in clearing away so much dead wood and debris and have now created a path through the trees and bushes leading from where the wood starts on the far right hand side of the field (just above where the play area is) and going forwards towards the entrances to Green Lane. Richard has also removed all the barbed wire on that side bordering onto Green Lane. Your support continues to be invaluable.

The Play Area. A second lorry load of bark was recently delivered and spread. Thank you, Simon. Appropriate signage remains in place.

The Sue Lane Memorial Bench has been washed and treated and now sits on the concrete base by the play area.
