The Introductory Rites

Sign of the Cross

*The Priest continues the Eucharistic Prayer.*

*At the elevation of the Host and the Chalice, the people acclaim: **My Lord and my God.***

*After the words of Consecration, the Priest sings:*

The mystery of faith:  
**We proclaim your Death, O Lord,  
and profess your Resurrection  
until you come again.**

*At the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer the people sing: **Amen.***
