THOUGHT FOR THE DAY from Kate Travers 'Where is God in this A&E waiting room?'

I am sitting in this extremely busy and noisy waiting room with my Mum. She had a fall whilst out shopping and the doctor suspects that she has broken her nose, so now we are waiting for a CT scan. I am people watching!

I have made a conscious decision not to sit with my head in my iPhone like most people are doing, when a thought pops into my head, more of a question really! "Where is God in this waiting room?" There are no visual prompts to remind people. To do that would be classed as inappropriate as we live in a multi-faith society.

I look at each individual within my line of vision. I'm looking for clues and wandering if God has crossed anyone's mind. Is anyone praying? Is anyone aware that God is here and ready to listen?

You see, places like this are full of anxious people who are worried and vulnerable.

They need reassurance, comfort, and trust. Trust in healthcare professionals to make the right decisions and take the appropriate action.

Has the thought of the Lord been pushed aside to make way for doctors with 'God Complex' personalities? Please don't get me wrong, being a healthcare professional myself, I am only too aware of the excellent work

doctors do within our NHS. However, I am only too aware of doctors who display superior attitudes and 'play God' when making life and death decisions, especially during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Personally, being a 'Christian', I find the thought of people putting more faith into doctors than God very un-nerving, because God's will and purpose should be done in and through our lives on earth, as it is in heaven. 
"Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much. So if
