Our Name.—At last there seems to be some probability of the settlement of a question which has been disturbing the minds of many for some time past. A requisition, signed by 37 tradesmen of the village, has been sent to the Vicar, requesting him to summon a meeting of the inhabitants of the parish for the purpose of taking such steps as shall be considered best to induce the post office authorities to adopt the legal title of “Hampton Hill.” The following are the words of the requisition:—“We, the undersigned tradesmen in the village of Hampton Hill, beg you to summon a meeting of all the inhabitants of the district for the purpose of taking such steps as may be deemed advisable to induce the post office authorities to adopt the legal title of the parish, viz., ‘Hampton Hill.’ We feel sure that the present uncertainty as to its name is prejudicial to the interest of its business men. Whatever may be the arguments urged in favour of either name, we not only prefer the name of ‘Hampton Hill,’ but we cannot forget that it is its legal name, and has the authority of an Order in Council, and has also been adopted by the

“railway authority. We are anxious, moreover, that the settlement made now should be final, which, if the name of ‘New Hampton’ be retained by the post office, is not likely to be the case. We understand that even now half the letters are addressed to Hampton Hill, and we believe that a very large majority are in favour of that designation.” A meeting therefore will be held at the school, on Wednesday, June 4th, at 8 p.m., and it is hoped that there may be a large attendance, and that it may result in the settlement of this vexed question. Whether those who nearly thirty years ago adopted the name were wise in so doing is not the question we have to consider. There can be no doubt that it is the legal name, and further, there can be little doubt that “Hampton Hill” is a more attractive name to strangers than “New Hampton.” It was no doubt intended to draw attention to the fact that the village does stand up higher than its neighbours, and to this doubtless it owes its well-deserved reputation as a particularly healthy locality. The prosperity of the place depends in no small degree upon its good reputation being preserved amongst those who are looking out for a fresh abode.

Our Schools.—We cannot allow the Magazine to go forth without some mention of the sad termination of the mastership of Mr. Martin after 20 years’ service. He was a thoroughly able and efficient master, and for many years commanded the respect and sympathy of the inhabitants of the village. Lately, however, he had allowed himself to get into money difficulties, and apparently unable to meet claims which were pressed upon him, he has left his post and, as far as it can be conjectured, has probably gone abroad. Our sympathies will be with his wife and six children, who are left behind at present almost totally unprovided for.

The time has now arrived for the collection of the annual subscriptions, and we give a full list of the subscribers, with the amount which they have hitherto subscribed or promised, and also the amount of donations given in answer to the special appeal which was made in the autumn with a view to averting the threatened School Board. We would remind the ratepayers that although the effort which was made has done something to improve our position, that still there is a heavy deficit to be made up, and that it will require the continued efforts of all to enable us to keep open our schools on a voluntary basis, and avoid the necessity for a Board.
