MY DEAR FRIENDS,

Most of our organizations are now in working order, but there is only space for a brief reference to them.

The first Concert of the season proved to be a great success. The programme was exceedingly good and most varied in character, and we are very much indebted to the committee who arranged it, and to all who took any part in it. I ought especially to mention Mr. Ivimey, whose violin performances were a great treat. Mrs. Barker brought a large contingent of helpers. I do not remember that we have had a more enjoyable entertainment.

The next will take place on Monday the 16th, and will consist of a Dramatic Performance, which is being diligently prepared for.

The Lads' Brigade has made an excellent beginning this season, and the Company has almost reached its full numerical limit. We are hoping now to form a small drum and fife band in connection with it.

The Drawing Examination, in connection with the Science and Art Department, took place in the Boys' School on the 28th ult. The number present was 183, out of 190 on the books. The other seven were kept away by illness.

A long list of subscribers to the Day Schools will be found below. Very few old subscriptions have lapsed, and I am glad to say the new ones have more than made up for them. There are still a few subscriptions to come in which will be incorporated with next year's accounts.

Mr. Evans informs me that the Curate's Fund is in need of additional help. The balance in hand with which the Fund started, is being gradually exhausted, and will shortly disappear. May I appeal to members of the congregation who do not at present subscribe to do so? Subscriptions will be thankfully received by Mr. Evans at Eton Lodge.

I propose to give a course of Six Lectures on the Epistle to the Hebrews, in connection with the Diocesan Church Reading Union, on Thursday mornings at 11.30 at the Mission Room, Eastbank Road, commencing November 5th.

The Missionary Working Parties have begun again, and are held at the Vicarage every alternate Friday, at 2.30 p.m. Additional Members will be heartily welcomed. The same ladies have charge of it as hitherto, viz.: President, Mrs. Job; Treasurer, Mrs. Handcock; Secretary, Mrs. Hubbard; Manager of Work, Miss Barnard.

A Young Women's Bible Class is held at the Mission Room, Eastbank Road, every Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock, by Mrs. Barton. Girls over 16 will be welcomed. The Mission Room will be open to members of the G.F.S. and other girls over 14, on Tuesday evenings, commencing on the 10th inst, from 8 to 9.30. Mrs. Job, Mrs. Barton, and other ladies will be present.

The Annual Offertories for the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, will take place on Advent Sunday. The preacher will be the Rev. C. B. Seifferth, a Missionary from Guinea and deputation from the parent Society. Special preachers have been arranged for the Wednesday evenings in Advent.

The death of the Archbishop of Canterbury, on Sunday the 11th ult. was a great blow to the Church. It is generally admitted that he was one of the best Archbishops the Church has ever had. He was wise, good, and generous, and worked indefatigably for the good of his fellow men. He was taken ill in the Church at Hawarden immediately after the commencement of the service, and passed away quietly and peacefully in a few minutes. If it were not that we know the great Head of the Church can carry on His work in His own way, and raise up and endow men for it, we should feel that the loss was irreparable; as it is we feel that the work of God will go on without interruption. The Archbishop's successor is to be our own Bishop of London. A better selection could not have been made, but while we rejoice in his advancement, we cannot but regret his removal from us. We can only hope and pray that in the providence of God, a fitting successor may be appointed in his place.
