MY DEAR FRIENDS,

Below will be found a long list of subscriptions for the Day Schools, which on the whole may be taken as very satisfactory. Church people in Hampton Hill have certainly been generous. We are very much indebted to Miss Barnard for the trouble she has taken in collecting. If the Education Bill now before Parliament becomes law, we shall not have to trespass to the same extent upon our supporters in future, but it will still be necessary for us to keep our Schools in good repair, and so, notwithstanding the fact that we shall have to pay our full share of the rates, we shall also have to raise a considerable sum by voluntary contributions for the maintenance of our School Buildings.

There will be an Intercessory Service on behalf of Rescue and Preventive Work, at the Church on Wednesday, the 5th inst., at 3 o'clock. All Church workers and others interested in this work are invited to be present.

The Communicants' Meeting this month will be on the 10th inst.

I propose to give three Lectures in connection with the Church Reading Union, in the Eastbank Mission Room, on Wednesday, at 4.30 p.m., as follows:—12th, "Christian Character and Conduct." 19th and 26th, "Church History of the Fifth Century."

The subscription to the C.R.U. is one shilling a year. The Secretaries are Mr. Joseph and Mrs. Job.

The Lads' Brigade has begun well with an orderly set of boys, and all looks promising. Dr. Howard, the Captain, and Mr. Phillips are doing their best to make it a success.

There is to be a meeting for the members of the Mothers' Union on the 18th inst., at the Schools, at 8 p.m. Mrs. Creighton, the wife of the late Bishop of London, has kindly promised to come and speak. On this occasion fathers are also invited to come, as well as mothers who are not members. I hope we may have a very good attendance.

The Annual Conversazione is fixed for Thursday, the 20th inst., at the Victoria Hall, when I hope we shall have a large gathering. The doors will be open at 7 p.m. There will be tea at side tables which will be handed round. There will be no reserved seats. We shall have Music, Singing, and Recitations by well known friends, and I hope to give an account of my visit to Rome, with lime-light pictures. The proceeds will be for the Curate's Fund and other parochial needs. Admission will be one shilling, but tickets may be obtained from the District Visitors at the usual price.

The attendance at the Men's Service on the last Sunday in the month was fairly good and I hope will improve as the winter advances.

The offertories on Advent Sunday, the 30th inst., will be for the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel.

Winter Entertainments are provisionally fixed for December 9th, January 20th, and February 17th.
