MY DEAR FRIENDS,

The Sunday School Excursion on the 20th ult., was one of the most successful we have had. The weather was perfect, and although we started early and came home late, our large party found plenty of things to entertain them in Portsmouth and Southsea. We took two hundred and one children, and a large number of parents and friends joined us. This is always a hard day for the Teachers, but their work was far lighter than it might have been owing to the excellent behaviour of the children.

A large number of people have kindly sent contributions for the Treats Fund, through Miss Barnard, and direct to me, but we have not yet received more than half of the total required, and I must make a further appeal for help.

I am glad to say I have received several of the papers sent with the Magazines last month, with generous contributions for our various funds. I shall be very grateful if others will fill up and return the papers as soon as convenient.

The Temperance Committee have decided to hold another open-air Meeting this Summer, and it will take place in the Vicarage Garden, on Tuesday, the 5th inst., at 7.30. Mr. Eardley-Wilmot, from the Central Society, has promised to give an Address. There will be light refreshments at the close. Tickets may be obtained from the members.

The Annual Flower Show is fixed for the 13th inst., and will be held in the Grounds of Mr. Clifton Robinson.

The Sports, in connection with the Working Men's Institute, are to take place on Wednesday, the 20th inst.

As St. James's Day comes on a Monday, and the Schools break up on the previous Friday, the usual treat will be on the Friday afternoon, and will take the usual form. The children and Teachers will meet at the Schools at two o'clock and march through the village, with band and banners, to the Vicarage. The children's tea will be at four o'clock. Members of the congregation and parents of the children will be heartily welcomed. Gifts of provisions for the children's tea, and toys, &c., for prizes, will be thankfully received. The Festival Services will commence on Sunday evening, St. James's eve. On the Monday there will be celebrations of Holy Communion at 7.30 a.m. and at 11 a.m., and Choral Service at 8 p.m. The offertories on St. James's Day will be for the Treats' Fund. The decoration of the Church will be done on the Saturday. Gifts of flowers and the loan of plants will be thankfully received.

The Communicants' ordinary Meeting will be omitted this month. The Annual Meeting and Tea will, if possible, take place in the Vicarage Garden, on Monday, the 18th inst.
