About 80 Band of Hope members went to the Annual Competitions at the Crystal Palace on May 23rd, and again we did well. The junior boys won the medals for Morris Dances—an additional medal was given to Miss Lush who trained them. Beatrice Chapman was second in junior recitations, and Winnie Newman third in the senior, while Wells and Nightingale were fourth for singing, and fifth for recitation. Considering that the Competitions were for the whole diocese these performances are most creditable.

I hope a large number of people will be present in the Church Room on June 9th, when Miss Bridgman the chief organizer of the C.E.T.S. work in the diocese, will give the Address.

At the Annual Meeting of the C.E.M.S., held on Tuesday, May 26th, a very encouraging report was read by Mr. C. H.
